

THE HISTORY OF John T. Hartman Elementary

John T. Hartman became a part of KCPS with the annexation of the Ruhl-Hartman District in 1947. The school was named in honor of a Presbyterian Missionary who helped organize several churches in the first quarter of the century. Neighbors said that Mr. Hartman would pitch a tent in a neighborhood and hold Sunday school meetings from which an organized church would develop. He is credited with founding the former Prospect Avenue Presbyterian church, the Covenant Presbyterian Church, and the Trinity Presbyterian Church.

In 1986, John T. Hartman School became John T. Hartman Investigative Learning Magnet. During the 2002-2003 year, Hartman joined the Missouri Accelerated Schools Program. Hartman returned as a KCPS neighborhood school in 2009 as a school of choice with positive, active involvement of parents, staff and community.
