Lincoln was originally organized as an elementary school in 1865 at 10th & McGee Street and was called Lincoln Elementary in commemoration of



the great emancipator, Abraham Lincoln. Over the years, the school grew, moved locations, added a high school given the name, "Castle on the Hill." Fall 2019, Lincoln Middle School was reopened across the street.

Since the original school's founding, Lincoln has evolved, the name has changed, but the purpose and mission has remained clear: to help nurture and develop thoughtful, caring, high-achieving graduates. Lincoln Middle continues today with that tradition.

Admission Requirements:

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- Students must have a record of good citizenship
- Applicants must also have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Applicants must score at or above the 60th percentile* on a national standardized reading and math test to be eligible for entrance

*A limited number of students may apply to enter on a probationary basis if they score at or above a cumulative percentile of 130 on a national standardized test in math and reading, with neither score below the 55th percentile. Lincoln College Preparatory Academy Middle School is a unique learning community that values and demonstrates respect for individuals and educational experience at every level. Dedicated students, expert faculty, caring and supportive parents and community partners work together to create a place that exemplifies what is possible in public education.

Lincoln Middle is home to challenging programs that yield great results. Our standardized test scores have established Lincoln as a premier school on a local, state and national level.

Beyond students reaching high academic achievements, we are nurturing extremely capable, creative and ethical leaders ready to positively change the world.

Grade level core classes will be located together to create a synergistic team. The design of the school will encourage collaboration between varying work groups. Classrooms will be allowed to open into hallways to provide independent and small group study areas as well as large group presentations.

Elective courses for all students will also be located together. In addition to the team format, the school will include large spaces devoted to maker space, lab, lecture and breakout areas.

The administrative team will be spread throughout the core areas to provide students easy access to advisory needs.

Lincoln Middle will include three career pathways focusing on engineering, computer science and biomedical and foreign languages including French, Spanish and Mandarin Chinese.
