# THE HISTORY OF Northeast High School

Northeast High School is a comprehensive high school for grades ninth through twelfth. The four-story structure was built in 1914 and deemed one of the great structures of its time. In 1988, the interior of the building was renovated and a new gymnasium, weight room and locker rooms were constructed on the south side of the building.



During one period of its history, Northeast was considered a magnet themed school-Law, Public Service, and Military (JROTC). Classroom spaces were constructed to support these themes such as a mock courtroom, judge's chambers and jury room. The interior of the building was renovated in 2014.

# **PROGRAMS & SERVICES**

Northeast High School offers a wide variety of Kansas City Public School District services and community partner programs to better educate our students.

### **Mentoring and character development**

In partnership with My Brother's Keeper, Northeast provides every freshman student with an in-building or community mentor to help guide them through their first year. With their mentors, students will learn and develop important life skills and academic habits.

# **Early College Academy**

The Early College Academy (ECA) is a partnership between KCPS and MCC-Penn Valley. Qualified and highly motivated high school juniors and seniors attend college classes full time on the Penn Valley campus. Students graduate with both their high school diploma and associates degree. With the first two years paid for by KCPS, students can then finish their Bachelor's degree at minimal cost.

### Skills for life

Manual Career and Technical Center is a shared-time attendance center for KCPS high school students and charter school students. The students generally attend Manual during their junior and/or senior years. Manual offers 14 career and technical programs at six sites. From culinary arts to engineering, waste water management, medical sciences and more, students graduate career or college ready.

# **Building leaders, preparing for success**

Junior Reserved Officer Training Corps (JROTC) is instrumental in preparing high school students to become productive citizens and leaders in their personal and professional lives.

JROTC programs provide high school students with structure, self-confidence and a sense of purpose. The curriculum requires JROTC students to wear their full dress uniforms once a week and places strong emphasis on general hygiene and physical fitness.

### **English Language Learners**

At the secondary level, ELL students are placed in English I, II, III (beginning, intermediate, or advanced) or Intensive English, depending on their level of language proficiency. Students in these classes receive Communication Arts (reading, writing, language) instruction that follows the district core curriculum and English Language Proficiency Grade Level Expectations. The ESOL certified teachers in these classrooms provide adaptations to instruction, materials and assessment to match the students' language levels.

# **New Americans Progam**

The goal of the New Americans class is to help new-comers adapt to the new school environment, start the process of becoming literate in English and learn enough English and content to be able to move onto the next level of classroom instruction. In Elementary schools, the newcomer will move up into a mainstream classroom and receive support from another ELL teacher using the pull-out and/or co-teaching method. In High school the newcomer will move up to ESL I (Sheltered English), and be introduced to Math, Science and Social Studies through sheltered classroom instruction.
