
PHILLIS WHEATLEY History



ABOUT WHEATLEY

Phillis Wheatley Elementary is a comprehensive community elementary school serving students in kindergarten through sixth grade. Our goal is simple: Meet students where they are. With a full spectrum of special education programs and services for English Language Learners, Wheatley Elementary provides interventions and supports to help students to find success every day and master their grad level.

In addition to serving students within a defined geographic area, Wheatley also serves as a site for special needs students throughout their elementary career.

Special Education

Wheatley has five self-contained classrooms from kindergarten through sixth grade for a wide spectrum of disabilities. There is a full time nurse on site, and we provide speech, occupational therapy services and interpreters for hearing impaired students. These classrooms integrate with the rest of the school population during support classes and other all-school activities.

English Language Learners

The English as a Second Language program is designed to teach students who speak languages other than English how to understand, speak, read and write in English and to support students' culture and language whenever possible.
