countries representing a variety of cultures.


Postive Behavior Intervention

Garfield focuses on the advantages of positive behavior through the Missouri Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) initiative. Students are encouraged to focus on what they do right as a means to success. PBIS is divided into three tiers. Garfield has successfully implemented Tier 1 and has begun the steps of Tier 2. Garfield was presented the Bronze Award and Silver Award for Achievement. The PBIS team meets bi-monthly to assess and evaluate the program's success and student achievement.

Garfield has partnered with Truman Medical Center Behavioral Health to transition into a Trauma-Sensitive School. School personnel can then help children overcome adversity by building resiliency.
