
## An overview of IB

  - Student's interests and passions

## **Assessment in IB**

- Mostly Country Day coursework for Country Day grades
- Variety of major assessments for each subject
- Good scores on IB work leads to an IB Diploma
- IB scores and transcript totally separate from Country Day transcript



# Recent success of Country Day's IB Program

- Country Day IB scores often exceed US and World average scores
- Great college matriculations
- From 2017-2021, 51% of IB students earned at least one scholarship
  - Over \$9.5 million in scholarships awarded
- 2 IB alumni published in science journals as undergraduates
- Multiple Division I and Division III student athletes
- Theatre state champions
- Overwhelmingly positive survey of IB Classes 2021-23



## **Good candidates for IB**

- Well-rounded, solid academic talent
- Strong approach to school
- Genuine interest in the program
- Demonstrate the qualities of the IB learner profile
  - Inquirer, open-minded, knowledgeable, caring, thinker, risk-taker, communicator, balanced, principled, reflective



## **Application process (dates subject to change)**

- Students complete personal statement (due 2/28)
- Faculty complete an online rec form (due 2/28)
- Mr. Peery pulls transcripts for all applicants
- IB Faculty Committee will anonymously evaluate all applications
- Admissions decisions released on or around March 22
  - Accepted, denied, or provisionally accepted
- All accepted students must meet with Mr. Peery on March 23-25
- April 6: deadline for committing to IB
