College Credit Plus

- CCP program operational since 2015/16 school year.
- Allows students to attend an Institute of Higher Education (IHE) to earn both high school and college credit

What is CCP? (College Credit Plus)

Students taking University credit through ANY mode (at PSHS, on campus or online) are dually enrolled:

- They are concurrently a student at BOTH institutions and their final grade lands on a transcript at each school
- Course rigor, content and all exams are the same regardless of where/how the course is taught
- Students must complete all prerequisite coursework (for example: high school *Chemistry* must be completed before taking *Advanced Chemistry*)

Who can participate?

- All students entering grades 7-12 in the Fall of 2022 may participate IF they meet the admissions standard for the college or university
- Public high schools must agree to work with institutions within 30 miles

Students Entering Grades 7-10:

Unless students have been accelerated, the only way for these students to participate in CCP is for them to take courses *online* or *on campus* since all courses taught at PSHS by our faculty require prerequisite coursework such as HS Chemistry or HS Algebra 2.

What courses are available?

- PSHS holds agreements with YSU and EGCC
- Students may take any course *for which they qualify* as follows:
 - At PSHS
 - On Campus
 - Online
- Semester hours may not exceed 120 during a student's high school career or 30 in any given year. Student's will be charged for additional hours.

What *YSU* courses are taught at PSHS??

The following courses are taught by our faculty who have been hired as adjunct professors. They possess Masters degrees PLUS 18 semester hours of post-graduate coursework in their subject area (mandated by CCP law)

- **Advanced Chemistry** (CHEM 1515 and 1516) 8 hours
- **Calc and AP Calc** (MATH 1571) 4 hours
- **Advanced PreCalculus** (Math 1510 and 1511) 7 hours
- **Physical Geology** (GEOL 1505) 4 hours
- **STEM Physics** (PHYS 1501 plus lab) 5 hours
- **AP or Advanced Biology** (BIOL 2601 and 2602) 8 hours
- **Amer Lit & Writing I** (Eng 2618 and Eng 1550) 6 hours

EGCC Courses taught at PSHS:

- **Advanced Government (PSC101)** 3 sem hours
- **Intro to Criminal Justice (CJT101)** 3 sem hours
- **Human Anatomy/Physiology (BIOL 107)** 4 sem hrs
- **Human Anatomy/Phys 2 (BIOL 108)** 4 sem hrs

Transferability

- **What if I do not plan on attending YSU or EGCC?**
- **All courses are “TAG” courses (Transfer Assurance Guaranteed) with transfer assured at all public universities in Ohio. Transfer is *probable* at most private universities in Ohio**

How to Qualify:

- Colleges and universities are not permitted to have different standards for admission for CCP students. Qualifying GPA and ACT scores are the same as for any undergraduate who applies for admission to that institution.

Additional Points to Consider:

- YSU – Students age 14 or younger must be accompanied at all times by their parent while on campus
- ***Students are mandated to attend summer orientation and advisement***
- EGCC – Students must be 16 to participate in on campus courses

Additional Points to Consider:

ACT/SAT scores do not guarantee course placement:

-Even if they are admitted, students will be notified by the institutions if additional placement testing needs to occur at the university by a specific date. This is for online, campus-based, or courses at PSHS.

- Free Tuition, taste of college, independence
- Head Start on College coursework
- Course Selection
- Learn to succeed in a college course in the “comforts of home”
- Academic Challenge

- Cons:

- Scheduling conflicts
- Student Populations

- Course rigor
- “Only get to be a high school kid once...”
- School Calendars differ (breaks, snow days etc.)
- Student Maturity and responsibility
- EOC Exams
