4. A copy of the page: "Expected Family Contribution" (EFC) or the "Student Aid Index" (SAI) from the FAFSA.
5. A transcript issued by Mrs. Jones in the Steele Counseling Office.
6. Any additional requirements for specific scholarships.

All scholarships awarded must be claimed by **September 30, 2022.**

<p>Tom Steury Student Athlete Memorial Scholarship</p>	<p>Two students will be awarded the Tom Steury Student-Athlete Memorial Scholarship.</p> <p>Tom Steury attended Marion L. Steele High School from 1959-1962. Tom was an outstanding and well-known distance runner who improved his record-breaking times year after year in track and cross country at the local, regional, and state levels before earning a scholarship to run at Bowling Green State University. As a direct result of Tom's freshman year success in track and Coach Dick Cooley's foresight, the Amherst High School cross country program was established in Tom's sophomore year in 1960. Tom's leadership and work ethic laid the foundation for many students to compete, and Amherst has since produced many fine runners who have earned countless local and state records. Tom's fortitude and determination were recognized by all students and community leaders. He did the necessary hard work that inspired others to compete and succeed at higher levels. Tom was inducted into the Amherst Sports Hall of Fame in 2022 for his excellence in running.</p> <p>The Tom Steury Student-Athlete Memorial Scholarship has been established to help financially support graduating student-athletes to further their education after graduating from Marion L. <p>Main Street Amherst Scholarship</p>	<p>Four scholarships will be awarded. Students must submit a two to three-minute video presentation (no longer) answering the following questions:</p> <p>What is your full, legal name? Are you planning on attending college? If so which college? What is your career plan and plan for the future? What have you done to help your community?</p> <p>Senior applicants MUST live and attend Amherst Exempted Village School District and be enrolled at Marion L. Steele High School and/or the Lorain County Joint Vocational School in the Senior Class of 2022. All scholarships must be used towards college.</p> <p>Two students will be selected from Marion L. <p>Dominic Konopka Scholarship</p>	<p>Dominic Konopka attended Amherst from kindergarten through high school. He graduated in 1989 from Marion L. Steele as the Salutatorian of his class with a 4.0 GPA. Some of Dominic's additional accomplishments include being an Ohio Academic Scholarship finalist, member of the National Honor Society, class officer, Treasurer of the Junior Achievement Economics Program, Homecoming King, Amherst Gallery of Success Committee and a member of the Academic Hall of Fame. Dominic enjoyed many sports and found his knack in football where he rewrote the Amherst record books as a three-year Varsity letterman and senior team captain. He went on to graduate from Miami University and the Haas School of Business at the University of California, Berkley. He then embarked on a promising career as a brand manager for Proctor & Gamble. On February 16, 1999, a virus suddenly took Dominic's life at the young age of 28.</p> <p>The Dominic Konopka scholarship was established for two reasons. 1.) To financially support a graduating senior from Marion L. Steele High School in his/her quest to further education at a four-year college or university. 2.) To carry the memory of Dominic's competitive spirit and love for life. If you are selected to receive this scholarship, you must provide proof of enrollment as a full-time student, for the next academic year, in a four-year college or university. To qualify for years two, three, and four of this scholarship, you must present an academic profile after each academic year of full-time collegiate enrollment and achieve a cumulative grade point average of 3.3 (on a 4.0 scale) for all academic work completed during your collegiate enrollment resulting in degree credits. Failure to meet any of these requirements will automatically disqualify you for the balance of the scholarship award. Proof of full-time enrollment and transcripts need to be sent to dkscholarshipfund@hotmail.com. Scholarship checks will be dispersed directly to you, the recipient, for all qualifying years of this scholarship once the requirements are met. To be considered for this scholarship, please write a maximum 500-word essay on why you are the best candidate for the Dominic Konopka Scholarship.
