At last night's School Board meeting the Board members unanimously approved the <u>Remote Snow Day Recommendation</u> that was proposed by the Leadership Council. The proposal recommends that after three weather related school closings, any additional days would be remote.



Teachers will be prepared to provide students with "low tech" or "no tech" school work for those remote learning days. As we have already had three snow days this school year - the final day of school for the 2021-2022 will be Friday, June 17, 2022.

The statewide surge of COVID-19 has increased school staffing shortages, and many schools have had to make emergency and disruptive pivots to remote learning, simply because they do not have enough adults to ensure that schools can operate safely and effectively.

WE NEED YOU to be a guest school staff member.

What is a Guest school staff member? Guest school staff members are substitute staff who are supporting or filling in for bus drivers, playground monitors, food service workers, feachers and support staff. Most are daylong positions, some are hourly, but even one day of substituting can make the difference, keeping a school open for students!

It's a simple process. Go to this $\underline{\text{website}}$, and follow the 9 steps for choosing where you would like to help, applying, and receiving the required training and background clearance for working in a school. Check it out: https://www.maine.gov/doe/substitute

What does it cost?

Nothing but a little time. It will take about one hour to fill out and submit the needed applications, and a \$15 application fee and \$55 fingerprinting fee will be charged, but this WILL BE REIMBURSED!! Getting fingerprinted will take a bit more time, but you can schedule an appointment that is convenient for you.

You can make a difference. You will be a hero, supporting your schools and ensuring that public education is available for all of Maine's children. You can work with the school district(s) of your choice, may be able to choose when and where you can help, and you will be inspired by the energy and miracles that fill our schools.

We will be using social media platforms to recognize our heroes and the organizations who are supporting Maine schools. Please join us- and be recognized as among those who are making a difference.




Panorama Student Surveys are Underway!

As you may already be aware, building our social-emotional learning (SEL) skills is an important goal across all of our schools again this year. Jan. 30 through Feb. 18th is our window for the surveys. They are being taken during the school day and only take about 15 minutes to complete.



This year the survey is shorter (only one part for about 10 to 15 minutes) and asks students to self-reflect on their Growth Mindset, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Positive Feelings, Challenging Feelings, and Supportive Relationships.

The data from the surveys last spring have helped us to better support students this year. As the data becomes available in March, we will share the results with you. We will again look at the results by topic and explore potential improvements for this year. Panorama includes a Playbook. It is an online professional learning library of evidence-based and research-backed SEL activities that school leaders and teachers can use with their schools and students.

Most Common of COVID-19:

Stay home with any YES response to the questions above.

Symptoms of illness can have many causes. Please keep your student home and contact your school nurse or primary care provider if your student is unwell. Students who present with symptoms while in school will be dismissed to hor the discretion of the nurse.
