Position Title: Adjunct Faculty, *Levine College of Health Sciences, Department of Public Health, Master of Public Health Program*

Position Location: Online, Asynchronous

Wingate University is seeking applicants to fill a part-time, adjunct teaching position for the Summer 2022 semester to teach a core course under the concentration of Health Promotion and Education.. The part-time position will utilize a course template to build content and instruct an online, asynchronous course. The position will begin in June 2022 with the academic term being July 5th - August 11th, 2022.

Discipline: Health Promotion & Disease Prevention
Course: PH 630 Principles of Health Promotion and Education

Course Description: Health promotion and education are foundational to the pursuit of meeting the challenges identified by Public Health 3.0 – a new era of enhancing and broadening public health practice that innovates beyond what is conducted in traditional public health programs. This course explores the theoretical underpinnings for how health behaviors can be changed at the individual, community and environmental level. Students will use case studies to explore behavioral models and how individual, social groups and environmental relationships influence change. Students will use principles of effective communication to analyze various types of public health communications, ranging from social media to major health campaigns. With an interdisciplinary focus, this course will ultimately equip students with the skills to ensure that proposed public health programs are designed in a way that can positively affect health behavioral change.

Ideal candidates will have a doctoral degree in the field of study or a related one, and graduate level teaching experience. Experience with learning management systems (i.e., Canvas) and content development tools such as Camtasia, Zoom, Snagit, and other e-learning tools is preferred.
