The Library plans to create a section in the Library in which students can share their written stories. According to the American University Writing program, writing and thinking go hand in hand. Students love to write.

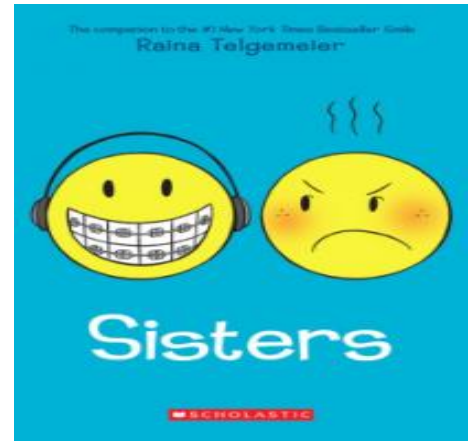
