We will also explore some less familiar ceramic methods, such as burnishing and sgraffito, while exploring pottery from other cultures. Students are encouraged to work at their own pace and appropriate level. This class is not just for beginners.

Cinderella FRENCH Camp (grades 1-4)

Peasants & Princesses are invited to step into the classic French fairytale of "Cendrillon", singing, speaking and living their French. The girls will continue to learn through puppetry, music, games, gestures, and dance as well as with theme-related crafts and one day of French cooking. They will review foundational vocabulary and phrases as well as those in our story around cleaning the house, getting dressed for the ball and the magical transformations that take place. The girls will engage in partner dialogue and writing activities to reinforce the learning. Students will be introduced to various drawing and painting materials including pan pastels, oil pastels, graphite, liquid watercolor and acrylic inks, reed pens, goose feathers, etc. Subjects will include landscape, trees, details from the natural world such as pine cones, bark, milkweed pods, bones, flowers, etc., still-life, live animals, and more. Students will go home with a full portfolio of assorted work at the end of the week!

Fairy Houses and Exploring in Nature (grades 1-4) Instructor: Margaret Vondermeden Fee: \$325 (\$350 after April 1)

Fairies abound on the Sacred Heart campus! We will make tea from our garden and hike in the woods. And while hunting for elements for our fairy houses, we will learn about the many insects and critters that call Sacred Heart home and discover how they choose or build their dwellings. We may even copy some of their ideas as we construct fairy homes. Whose tracks will we find along the way? Come and see!

Students will be learning basic mosaic techniques, planning the design and composition, choosing tile colors, laying a border, cutting the tiles, learning how to use the tools and equipment, and applying grout and final polishing. All students work at their own pace, and all levels are welcome. Completing a mosaic from scratch is a wonderfully rewarding accomplishment.
