# SCHOOL PROFILE 2021-2022

Gilman School is a diverse community dedicated to educating boys in mind, body, and spirit through particular emphasis upon academic excellence, athletic participation, and aesthetic appreciation. Gilman seeks to produce men of character and integrity who have the

## UPPER SCHOOL CURRICULUM (GRADES 9-12)

Gilman offers a highly rigorous college-preparatory curriculum. Students in the ninth and tenth grades take six courses each year. Juniors and seniors must take at least five courses each year.

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in some disciplines. Students must receive departmental approval to enroll in an AP class. Due to scheduling constraints, it is not always possible to honor each student's request.

**Departmental philosophy precludes offering an honors track in English or history.**

**English/History Honors Paper:** A one semester, ¼ credit course of independent study offered through the English and History Departments. Approved juniors and seniors, under the guidance of either the English or History Department, will compose a 15-20-page scholarly, critical essay. Final assessment includes an oral defense. History students are graded on a Pass/Fail basis. English students receive a number grade.

## COORDINATE PROGRAM

The Coordinate Program allows students to take courses at The Bryn Mawr School (BMS) and Roland Park Country School (RPCS). With approximately 200 course offerings among the three schools, including more than 40 senior English electives, this program with BMS and RPCS provides Gilman students with many opportunities to explore the benefits of an expansive curriculum in a co-educational environment.

## MEMBERSHIPS

*Global Online Academy (GOA)*, a consortium of the world's leading independent schools, whose mission is to translate into online classrooms the intellectually rigorous programs and excellent teaching that are hallmarks of its member schools. GOA grades are not included in a student's grade point average.

*Cum Laude Society (CLS)*, an academic honor society, inducts members based on the motto Areté (excellence in scholarship and moral virtue), Diké (justice), and Timé (dignity and honor). CLS inducts students in the fall of the senior year and an additional group of inductees in the spring of the senior year. An association of 382 chapters, Cum Laude members are found in independent and public schools in the U.S. and around the world.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Mathematics
- 3 years of Foreign/Classical Language
- 2 years of Lab Science
- 3 years of History
- 4 years of Athletics
- 50 hours of community service
- 21 credits total required for graduation

In order to satisfy the State of Maryland graduation requirements, students must take a total of six credits of math and science combined.

Athletics are co-curricular within the Gilman program, and are considered the last class of the day. Students are required to participate in three seasons of interscholastic or intramural athletics. Seniors may opt out of one season.

## GRADING

- Grading is either **numerical or Pass/Fail**; all courses are either one or two semesters in length.
- **Rank:** Because of the small size of the graduating class, Gilman does not rank its students.

### COVID-19

In March 2020 (at the end of the third quarter), Gilman's campus closed, and students and faculty engaged in virtual learning for the remainder of the academic year. The final year-end grade for 2019-2020 was an average of all four quarters. The official grading policy did not change during virtual learning. In response to COVID-19, all 2020 spring athletic seasons were canceled.

The 2020-2021 school year began virtually and moved into a hybrid in-person/virtual schedule on September 21, 2020. In-person students had the opportunity to engage in intramural sports, and most teams returned to play, with reduced schedules. Glee Club and Design and Woodworking did not meet in 2020-2021 due to COVID-19 restrictions. While other musical ensembles (String Ensemble, Concert Band, Jazz Band, and Bell Choir) met virtually throughout the year, enrollment was somewhat diminished due to the pandemic.

Gilman returned to its full on-campus schedule for the 2021-2022 school year.
