Lenten Opportunities: Lent begins on Wednesday, March 2nd.

Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, and Good Friday, April 15th are days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed.



Parish Lenten Books: Parishioners are invited to take one book per household from the narthex starting on Ash Wednesday, to prayerfully journey through Lent with fresh and meaningful reflections on the daily Mass



readings. In just minutes per day, the insightful meditations of Not by Bread Alone can deepen your experience of this solemn season of prayer and penance. Books will be mailed to our homebound parishioners. Each CCF & OLGC School family will receive the book Abundant Mercy, with family devotions and activities for Lent. This down-to-earth devotional offers families a page-a-day guide to daily inspiration. Encourages family discussion, prayer and together time.

Parish Updates & Events

Safety & Security Project: As mentioned at the Town Hall, the Diocesan Office of Risk Management conducts annual safety inspections of the parish and school procedures and facilities. Based on those reports and in conjunction with the OLGC Safety & Security Team, Facilities Committee, and the local police & fire departments, we are upgrading our closed-circuit television and access control system (surveillance cameras and key card system). On February 7, 2022, Datawatch Systems started upgrading and installing components for our new video surveillance cameras, a new monitoring system, new door card readers, alarm contacts, and intercoms on the campus. With these new systems, some doors, locks, and keys will be changed, as well as some operating procedures to ensure that we keep our students, staff, parishioners, and guests as safe as possible.

One aspect of the project was to improve lighting on campus. The first phase of that project is complete as the lights on the Bell Tower were replaced with LED fixtures to better light the tower circle area. In addition, the parking lot light fixtures have all been replaced with LED light fixtures by our facilities team. We have installed 50 LED fixtures with 7 more to be replaced. The poles will be painted this spring. You should see an improved difference in the lights at night.

• Normas para el ayuno y la abstinencia: El miércoles de ceniza, 2 de Marzo, y el viernes santo, 15 de abril, son días de abstinencia y de ayuno. También deben abstenerse los viernes durante la Cuaresma. Todas las personas a partir de los 18 años de edad y los que no hayan cumplido los 59 años de edad, deben ayunar. Se permite comer una vez durante el día de ayuno, aunque también pueden comer dos veces para mantener la energía, según la necesidad de cada individuo. Sin embargo, estas dos comidas no deben igualar a la cantidad de una comida completa. No se puede comer entre comidas, pero está permitido tomar líquido, incluyendo leche y jugos. La abstinencia se debe cumplir desde los 14 años de edad en adelante. En los días de abstinencia, no se debe comer carne, aunque si la salud o la habilidad para cumplir su trabajo se ve seriamente afectado, la ley no lo obliga. Si tiene alguna duda sobre la práctica del ayuno o de la abstinencia, consulte al Sacerdote de su parroquia. El ayuno, la limosna y la oración, son las tres disciplinas tradicionales durante la Cuaresma. Los feligreses y los catecúmenos deben realizar estas prácticas con seriedad en espíritu de penitencia y en preparación para la Iniciación a la Iglesia o para la renovación de las promesas Bautismales durante la Semana Santa

•Los viernes, tendremos Las Estaciones de La Cruz a las 7:pm, en la Capilla en español y en la Iglesia en inglés.
