The preschool will be housed in an existing classroom(s) and have a maximum of 15 students, for 2.5 hours per day, 4 days per week. No new staff. K-6 has 302 students (declining enrollment). They do not prepare meals on site; hot lunch is sent from Hanover. Note that WW-3-0026-R was a change to decrease design flows.

Act 250 Jurisdictional Opinion

This is a jurisdictional opinion issued pursuant to 10 V.S.A. § 6007(c) and Act 250 Rule 3(A). Reconsideration requests are governed by Act 250 Rule 3(B) and should be directed to the district coordinator at the above address. Effective May 31, 2016, any appeal of this decision must be filed with the Superior Court, Environmental Division (32 Cherry Street, 2nd Floor, Ste. 303, Burlington, VT 05401) within 30 days of the date the decision was issued, pursuant to 10 V.S.A. Chapter 220. The Notice of Appeal must comply with the Vermont Rules for Environmental Court Proceedings (VRECP). The appellant must file with the Notice of Appeal the entry fee required by 32 V.S.A. § 1431, which is \$295.00. The appellant also must serve a copy of the Notice of Appeal on the Natural Resources Board, Dewey Building, 1 National Life Drive, Montpelier, VT 05620-3201, and on other parties in accordance with Rule 5(b)(4)(B) of the Vermont Rules for Environmental Court Proceedings.

BASIS FOR DECISION Terry, I appreciate the opportunity to address information presented on the Project Review Sheet (PRS) compiled by your office on March 9, 2018. I understand that the PRS information reflected student and staff information for Marion Cross School (MCS) as presented by MCS representatives to add a Pre-K program to the current K - 6 MCS facilities. I have had the opportunity to review PRS information and to discuss actual student, staff, and flow information with the District's Director of Facilities and Business Administrator. In summary, I offer the following:	
1. The Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit issued under WW-3-0026-R on June 23, 2008 included 364 students and staff for 5,460 gpd (gallons per day). 2. District staff indicates: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. The projected student enrollment for the 2018-2019 school year is 289 at MCS (currently MCS only has 279 students enrolled for the 2018-2019 school year). b. The current staffing at MCS is 57 and will remain the same in the coming school year. c. Pre-K enrollment will not exceed 14 students. d. The total student and staff use for the coming year will not exceed 360, which is less than the 364 maximum permitted under WW-3-0026-R. 3. Our firm is working with the District to address repairs and improvements to the existing on-site wastewater disposal system that was installed pursuant to Indirect Discharge Permit ID-9-0021 on August 21, 1988. As we have discussed by phone, the District has installed a water meter to collect continuous data for more than six months, which should aid in our recommendations for repairs and improvements.	
Please let me know if you require any additional information to amend the PRS to allow the addition of a Pre-K program as we work to develop near term and long term repairs and upgrades to the existing MCS on-site wastewater disposal system.
