College Bound has changed!!

Be aware that your student will not have a signature sheet but in order to qualify for the scholarship there will need to be paperwork completed in high school!

Beginning with the 2019-20 school year, students enrolled in public school who are eligible for free and reduced price lunch in 7th, 8th, or newly eligible in 9th grade will be automatically enrolled in

College Bound. This is through a partnership with OSPI and WSAC. OSPI identifies free and

reduced price lunch eligible students via data from districts that is reported. Additionally, students in state

foster care at any point from 7th grade through age 21 (or they graduate high school) will be automatically signed up. This is

through a partnership with the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) and WSAC.
