Mr. Fagg,

This email is in response to your Freedom of Information Act request dated January 11, 2022.

You requested the following:

Access to and/or a copy of documentation of remote learning equipment reported as missing, damaged, broken, stolen or otherwise unavailable for use. For this request, please provide the information in aggregate including (if available): type of device, school that device assigned student attends, date of issuance, data or report of loss, and any other relevant information. In addition, please provide (if available) documentation showing the total number of remote learning equipment assigned.

Remote Learning

March 2020-June 2020 - no chromebooks issued to students.

August 2020-June 2021 - only a few instances of remote learning at certain grade levels.

August 2021 to present - all in-person learning so far.

For the remote learning periods mentioned above, there have been no instances of missing, damaged, broken, stolen or otherwise unavailable for use equipment, beyond normal wear and tear.

You have a right to have the denial of your request reviewed by the Public Access Counselor (PAC) at the Office of the Attorney General, 5 ILCS 140/9.5(a). You can file your Request for Review with the PAC by writing to:

You also have a right to seek judicial review of your denial by filing a lawsuit in the State circuit court, 5 ILCS 140/11.

If you choose to file a Request for Review with the PAC, you must do so within 60 calendar days of the date of this denial letter, 5 ILCS 140/9(a). Please note that you must include a copy of your original FOIA request and this denial letter when filing a Request for Review with the PAC.
