AP WORLD HISTORY

- OPEN to both **freshmen** & sophomores
- Taught by Adam O'Hair
- College-level course Expertly broken down into daily doses.
- Develop skills essential for success in high school and college
- FUN STUFF like "Villain of the Week"
- Typical reading, 6-8 pages with a short quiz the next morning.
- Designed "to develop a greater understanding of the evolution of global processes and contacts, in interaction with different types of human societies."
- Reading and writing requirements for the class are rigorous.
- Diligence and a capacity for hard work are essential.
- Students who successfully complete the AP World test earn college credit.

- Taught by Dahl & Eickhoff




- Elective—AP Freshmen class
