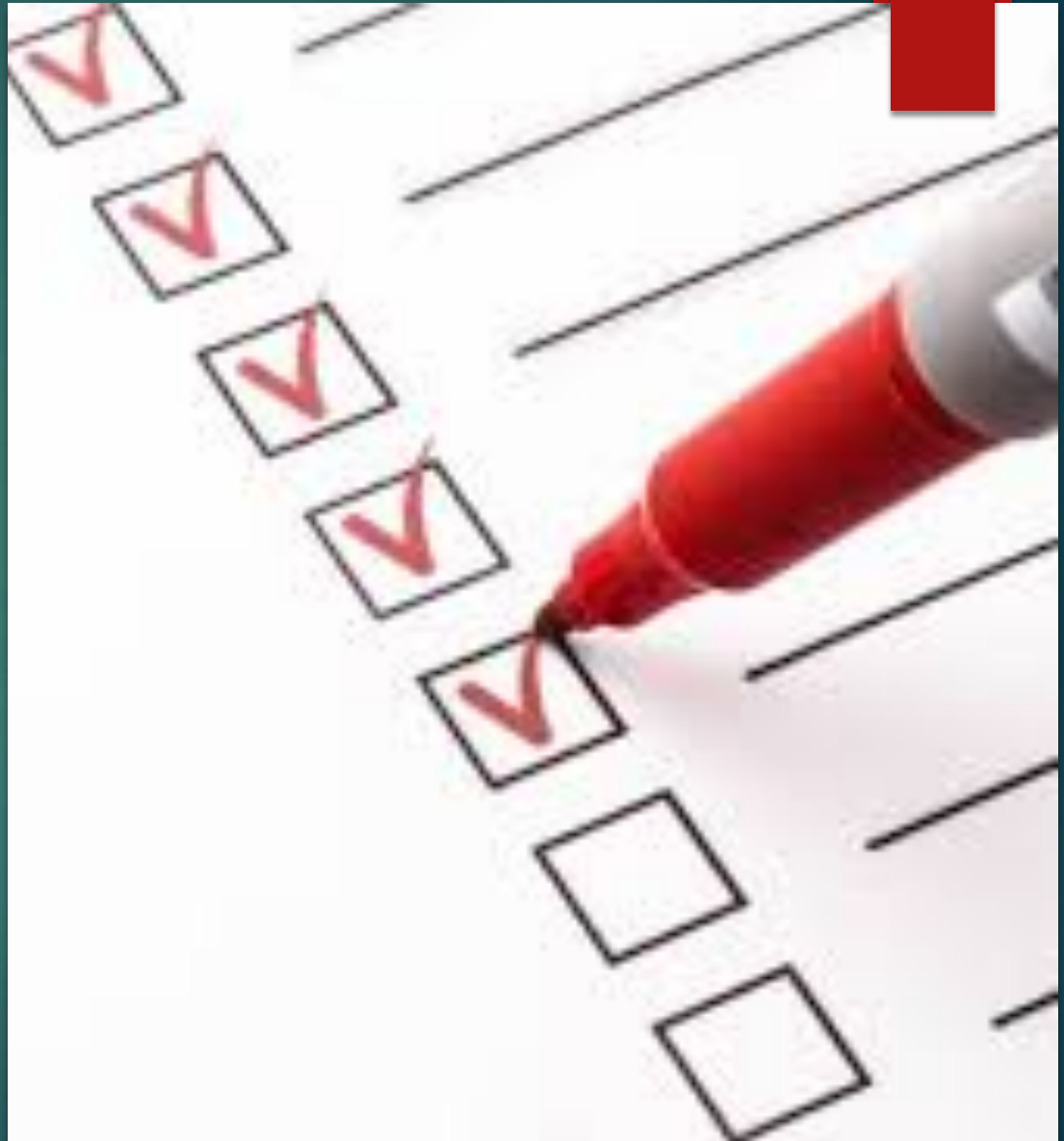

VOCABULARY

- ▶ **Required course:** a specific course you must pass to graduate.
- ▶ **Flexible Credit:** a course you CHOOSE to take, based on interests and your post high school path.
- ▶ **Prerequisite:** a requirement to meet before you take a class.
- ▶ **Credit:** you earn this by passing a class
 - 0.5 credit: passing a class for 1 semester
 - 1.0 credit: passing a class for 2 semesters

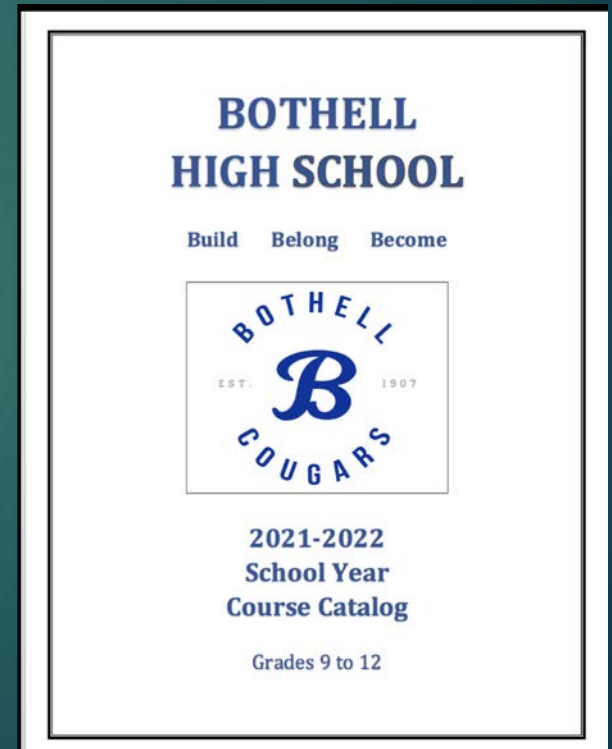

BEGINNING ART

<i>Length / Credit:</i>	<i>One Semester / 0.5 Credit</i>
<i>Grades:</i>	<i>9, 10, 11, 12</i>
<i>Fee:</i>	<i>\$15</i>
<i>Diploma Category:</i>	<i>Art</i>

No experience necessary. This basic course is a great place to start learning drawing skills and introduces students to the basic elements of art and principles of design while using a variety of media including pen and ink, pencil, oil pastel and cut paper. This class will teach students to draw in a step-by-step process. Students will learn how to use perspective, pattern, texture and color to create projects that are fun while improving knowledge of design. These skills are necessary to excel in all other art classes. This is a highly successful program that brings amazing results. Drawing skills are not required; even students with substantial art experience enjoy and benefit from this class.

INTERMEDIATE ART

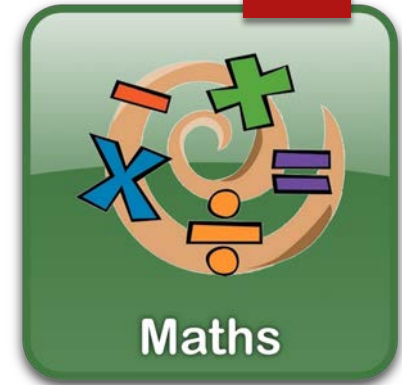
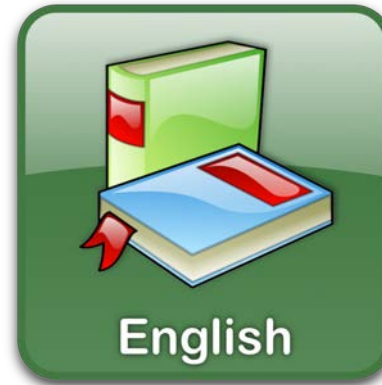
<i>Length / Credit:</i>	<i>One Semester / 0.5 Credit</i>
<i>Grades:</i>	<i>10, 11, 12</i>
<i>Prerequisite:</i>	<i>Beginning Art or instructor permission</i>
<i>Fee:</i>	<i>\$25</i>
<i>Diploma Category:</i>	<i>Art</i>

Intermediate Art is for students who would like to continue to develop and expand their abilities and interests in art. Projects are designed to increase students' drawing, painting and design skills while developing creativity and personal expression through a variety of media. This may include charcoal, conté, painting, pen and ink, mixed media, printmaking, 3-D design, oil pastel and chalk pastel.

Note: *Intermediate Art and Advanced Art are intended to be year-long classes, offering different curriculum for Fall and Spring Semesters. Enrollment in both semesters is encouraged, but not required.*

Freshman classes

- ▶ English 9 or Pre-AP English 9
- ▶ Math (Alg 1; Geometry; Alg 2 OR Alg 2/Trig)
- ▶ Life Fitness and Health
(Recommended for 9th grade)
- ▶ Science
 - ▶ **Biology or Biology Extensions** is recommended and fulfills the prerequisite for many of our other science classes.

Login to **StudentVue**; Have **Course Registration sheet** ready to guide you.

Click on **Course Request**

Enter each class you want **using the Course ID** (NOT THE CLASS NAME! MANY CLASSES HAVE SIMILAR TITLES).

Be sure you select both semesters for year-long courses.
ex: Biology SCB100 (**choose both A & B**).

Don't forget your **alternates!!** Have back ups for:

- First-year World Language
- Any elective course (ex: 1st choice= Photography, alternate = Basic Art)

No need to “save” or “lock course requests” – it auto-saves for you!
