The School Counseling Department cooperates with local scholarship committees in providing transcripts and other personal data whenever information is officially requested and official permission has been received for the release of the applicant's record; however, the recipients of the awards are determined solely by the sponsoring organizations. Once a scholarship has been awarded, it is important for the student to have the name of a person in that organization to answer questions in the future.

For example: "My College hasn't received the scholarship money for second semester. Whom should I contact?"

We would like to remind you that the scholarships contained in this booklet are from local organizations only. You should also apply directly to the financial aid office where you have submitted applications, or where you have been admitted, in order to determine your eligibility for their funds.

You should also be checking Scholarships on Naviance on a regular basis, to determine if you are eligible for any of those scholarships.

Awards: 101: makes awards ranging from \$500.00 to \$10,000.00. 101 determines how these awards will be applied over the course of a student's college career, and each summer student recipients are expected to reapply for any 101 award. All awards are sent directly to the recipients' schools.

Eligibility: Princeton High School seniors and graduating juniors who have been accepted to a two-year or four-year college or to a technical or vocational school. Applicants are required to apply for financial aid from the educational institutions and for applicable grants. 101: awards are made to qualifying students whose financial needs are not met by these other sources combined with family resources. This scholarship is based solely on need.

Eligibility: Awards are made based on achievement, character, motivation, and financial need. Scholarships are subject to renewal throughout the recipient's undergraduate college career based on continued financial need and satisfactory academic performance.

The program is open to all students who are permanent residents of Princeton. Scholarships are awarded to students attending two-year or four-year colleges in the United States.

Award: One annual award for four years for a descendant of a war veteran or a person who served in the U.S. Armed Forces during wartime.

Eligibility: Graduating high school seniors who reside in Princeton or West Windsor Twp., and who will be continuing their studies at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States. Students must also be the son (natural or adopted), stepson, grandson, great-grandson, daughter (natural or adopted), stepdaughter, granddaughter, or great-granddaughter of a war veteran or a person who served in the Armed Forces of the United States during wartime. The award decision is also based on financial need, achievement, and character.

Method of Application and Dates:

- Submit the completed application and all required attachments to the Princeton Area Community Foundation before May 1, 2022.

Applications will be reviewed by the Princeton Area Community Foundation and representatives of Princeton Post #76, American Legion.

Qualifications: Preference will be given (but not limited to) students who are interested in pursuing a career in teaching or some other field of education. Quality of transcript, character and participation in school activities will also be considered.

Awards: Scholarship awards are only for the first year. Factors considered in making these annual awards include financial need, high scholastic standing, qualities of unusual leadership and character, extracurricular activities, and promise of service and usefulness. It is understood that Scholarship awards shall revert to The Women's College Club Scholarship Fund if a recipient fails to fulfill the above requirements. The amounts of the awards are dependent upon the money available in the fund.

Eligibility: Applicants must be senior girls who (1) have attended Princeton secondary schools for at least two years; (2) have applied to (and subsequently register at) an accredited four-year American college or university; (3) have taken the College Board Scholastic Aptitude Test or the American College Test; and (4) are U.S. citizens.
