### About the Institute

The Linda Churchwell-Varga Summer Institute for Beginning Teachers of Color is a rigorous five-day summer workshop designed to provide deep and rich professional development around the art and craft of teaching, as well as to help selected Fellows understand the opportunities and joys that arise when teaching in an independent school.

Named after a longtime New City School faculty member, the Linda Churchwell-Varga Summer Institute for Beginning Teachers of Color will feature seminars led by New City School's master teachers, visits to area independent schools, and interactive panel presentations from independent school students, parents, staff, trustees, and heads of school. Through this work, Fellows will gain an excellent understanding of independent school culture and the pressing need for teachers of color in independent schools. Fellows will be awarded a \$500 stipend for their participation in the institute.

The Summer Institute will also feature sessions around progressive pedagogy, specifically focused on diversity, equity, and inclusion practices and social justice education, in addition to providing Fellows support with resume writing, interviewing, and the job search process.
