INFORMATION ABOUT THE EMHS DAYCARE PROGRAM

History

The Lake Washington Family and Consumer Sciences teachers were concerned about statistics of pregnancy of teenage mothers and that they were less likely to complete high school once becoming a parent. Teenage parent dropouts were interviewed ... all said they would return to school if there was a teen parent program and gave suggestions as to the curriculum. The data collected from the home visits was later used as part of a grant written in 1976.

Over the years the program moved to various sites within the LWSD and in 1982 the program moved to Emerson High School. The daycare became licensed with the State of Washington and became a fully functioning center which provides early childhood education to teenage parents and offers childcare for their children.

Learning Programs (Whole-Child Development)

In the Emerson Daycare, children are given encouragement, stimulation, and guidance in physical, intellectual, emotional, and social adjustment. Because each child is unique with individual interests and needs, the daily activities and play experiences are planned based on the ages, developmental levels, and interests of the children in the daycare.


Infants and toddlers receive quality individual care and attention. Their physical needs are monitored carefully. Their day is planned to coincide with home schedules for important routines like feeding and sleeping.

Toddlers participate in small groups and individual activities that encourage fine motor and language development. Older toddlers are encouraged to develop important skills such as following directions, problem solving and working cooperatively. We believe the best way to accomplish this through play as modeling.

PARENT ACCESS

The LWSD provides access to student information including student records, lunch accounts, and more via the Internet. This information is secure so that only you can see information about your student (s). The system through which you can view this information is called **Parent Access**.

When you are registered at school, you have secure access to the following types of student information:

- E-mail links to your student's teachers
- Volunteer Application
- Ability to make online credit card payments for fees/fines
- Family Access: the system that provides official student information on your student (s), including emergency contacts, attendance, end of term report card grades, immunization records, parent/guardian information, fees, etc.

LWSD ORCA CARD

Students who live within the LWSD boundaries and outside the one-mile radius from EMHS (as determined by the LWSD) will be issued a Metro Orca Card based upon determination of eligibility by the LWSD Transportation Department.

Passes will be active for use on METRO and SOUND TRANSIT. **The cards are now good for the duration of the students school years.** This year all eligible students will receive an ORCA card and at the end of the school year, only Seniors' cards will be turned off. In the following years only Freshman & new students will receive new cards. The ORCA Student agreement now covers this and states they are responsible for their card until the graduate. **Students will be charged a replacement fee of \$7.50 from the Transportation Department if they lose or damage their bus pass or if their pass is stolen.** The check should be written to Emerson High School and given to the office manager.

Students residing outside the boundaries of the LWSD are responsible for their own transportation to and from school. If a student inside the one mile wants a pass, they may purchase one from Metro at the same per trip price that LWSD pays. School Orca passes **cannot** be purchased through the school or LWSD Transportation Department.

FREE/REDUCED LUNCH PROGRAM

Nutrition Services offers a limited breakfast program at Emerson. Some options that are provided include items that can be heated in the microwave such as breakfast sandwiches. There are other cold items available such as cereal, breakfast bars, and bagels and cream cheese. Breakfast is available daily between 7:30-7:50 a.m. and between classes until fourth period.

For the 2021-22 school year, student meals will continue to be provided free of charge at all schools, regardless of income level. This USDA nationwide waiver allows for meals for the 2021-22 school year only. Even though there will be no charge for student meals, the Point of Sale computer system for meal accounting will still be utilized with a "no charge" for meals. Students will be able to purchase an extra entrée, meal, milk, and other ala carte items for an extra charge.

Nutrition Services will post daily lunch menus monthly.

Families that previously qualified for free or reduced-priced meal benefits will need to re-apply to continue receiving district-supported fee reductions and benefits such as extracurricular non-credit activities and summer school fees. Emerson participates in the free and reduced lunch program; obtain forms from the registration packet and/or the main office. ONE application covers the whole family; turn in application at youngest child's school.

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL


Students are NOT allowed to have even non-prescription medication on them at school – all medication must go through the Emerson Office, contact Sally Jenkins.

Parents/guardians are responsible for:

- ◆ Supplying all medications/transporting medication to and from school.
- ◆ Completing required medication authorization forms. **An authorization to administer medication form must be turned in for each medication - whether prescription or non-prescription. The form must be signed by the health care provider and parent and/or guardian. Medication cannot be given without the completed form.**
- ◆ All prescribed medication must be in the original, labeled prescription bottle, container or package.
- ◆ All non-prescription medication must be in original container and labeled by the parent, including: Student Name, Medication Name, Dosage, Date Issued, Name of Health Care Provider, and Time medication is to be given.

Scheduled medications are given between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM only.

FlashAlert.net—This service was designed for school districts to notify local media about changes to school schedules. As an added benefit, you can sign up for an account and get emails or text messages with emergency information. It is the first place notices are posted.



SchoolMessenger—LWSD will call employees by 5 a.m. and parents by 6 a.m. In some instances, decisions are delayed. In that case, the calls are made as soon as information is available. **Please note:** Human Resources must have the correct phone number on file for each employee. Otherwise, you will not get this courtesy call.
