

Unit 1 Our Community and Its Geography

Grade 2 Social Studies

Unit Description:

In this unit, students will learn about different types of communities and how communities change, grow, and develop over time. This sets the stage for the unit to follow where students will explore their heritage and traditions, and the impact of past events in their nation.
