4 weeks

Students explore the presidential administrations and their policies in the post-Cold War era, along with key events of U.S.-Middle East relations and their impacts on the U.S. economy and national security. Students also trace the roots of foreign and domestic terrorism, and how life in America has changed under the threat of terrorism.
