SPEAKER James Fuss (online submission) would like masks mandated.

**SPEAKER** Tia Whitaker spoke in favor of masking.

SPEAKER Lisa Flemming (online submission) is disturbed by the motion to rescind the Health

and Safety Plan. She has a daughter who has a pre-existing condition which puts her

at a greater risk for COVID-19. She is in favor or universal masking.

Face covering exemptions for Staff:

- · Eating or drinking
- Face covering break
- Outdoor activities
- When wearing a face covering creates an unsafe condition
- Medical or mental condition or disability documented in accordance ADA that precludes wearing a face covering
- · Alone in a vehicle or private office
- 1. Levels of community transmission defined as total new cases per 100,000 persons in the past 7 days (low, 0-9; moderate 10-49; substantial, 50-99, high,  $\geq$ 100) and percentage of positive tests in the past 7 days (low, <5%; moderate, 5-7.9%; substantial, 8-9.9%; high,  $\geq$ 10%.)
