



Dear Members & Friends of the SI Community,

THE FIRST ITALIAN JESUITS WHO ARRIVED IN SAN FRANCISCO IN 1849 would have a hard time recognizing the city and bay today, so different from what they found when they came to minister in the booming city by the bay. What has not changed over these years is the roots and reason why the Jesuits minister in churches, retreat centers, universities and high schools. We serve God and the human family in order to lead all of us to more Godly lives and a more virtuous and spiritual social order. Our roots are in Christ's life and message, to establish God's kingdom here on earth. Our reason for ministry is to educate our students to discover their talents and the vision that will inspire them to partner with Christ in transforming the world. This is heart of our Jesuit vision: service for new lives and a new creation.

During 2008-2009, we will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the California Province of the Society of Jesus, even though Jesuits were here as missionaries for 50 years before. In order to celebrate this century plus of Jesuit ministry in California, the new Superior General of the Jesuits, the Very Reverend Adolfo Nicholas, S.J. will visit the California Province in late January and early February – 20 years since a Fr. General visited California.

A second significant event for SI is the Jesuit Sponsorship Review process in the spring semester. Those early Italian Jesuit missionaries founded, staffed and developed what is now St. Ignatius Prep. Since the very first day the partnership between the Jesuits and the school has been an essential part of who we are. Following a review of our mission, our formation programs and our work by a visiting team, a formal agreement will be signed between the California Province of the Jesuits and St. Ignatius Prep in order to ratify and support the Jesuit identity of SI and affirm our Jesuit ties. A new process but with ancient roots.

While our Jesuit roots are ancient, the school is ever changing. This year marks momentous changes: a new Principal, new Deans, and new Board Chairs. As we welcome new leaders, we also strive to keep our campus current. As I write, we are completing three important projects to keep the campus safe, attractive and efficient. Each room, hallway and corner of the campus has been upgraded with a new smoke and fire detection system; the Orradre Courtyard, being renovated to create more open and inviting space for our students, will be covered with an atrium-like roof; and the kitchen has been remodeled to bring it to code and to serve better the students, faculty, Jesuits and the greater SI community with efficient space and state-of-the-art equipment. Combined, these necessary projects cost \$5 million, an endeavor that SI could never accomplish without your support.

This Jesuit ministry with ancient roots continually improves. It would be impossible for us to maintain the high quality of education and accessibility for our students without you. Thank you for your support, generosity and belief in God's work and the Ignatian vision.

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

The following are scholarships at Saint Ignatius College Preparatory, both perpetually and partially endowed. All scholarships listed in the first section are perpetually endowed. To meet current tuition needs, a new scholarship can be perpetually endowed at \$100,000. A corpus of \$25,000 is required to have a partial scholarship. The proceeds of the endowments are given annually to deserving and academically qualified SI students in accordance with the provisions of the scholarship. Anyone interested in establishing a perpetual memorial or commemorative scholarship should contact the Development Office.

(All scholarships started prior to July 2006 will be forever recognized as a perpetually endowed scholarship at the prior threshold of \$50,000, and as a partial scholarship at the prior threshold of \$12,500.)

STEVE LOVETTE'S LEGACY TO SI

MANY OF YOU WHO HAVE LOYALLY FOLLOWED THIS COLUMN for the past 19 years know it has stumbled upon a new author. It is with some sadness that I pen these words as SI bids adieu to the man who built SI's development department and who built much of what SI has become today. As we announced in our past issue of *Genesis V*, after 39 years at SI, Dr. Steve Lovette '63 has retired as SI's vice president. SI cannot thank Steve enough for his years of service to this place we hold near and dear.

An architect is one who can dream and envision a building where there is merely sand – someone with the wherewithal to design a foundation that takes on a life of its own and that produces programs and people whose full potential even its creator cannot envision. No other Jesuit high school has had a more profound architect than SI has had in Steve.

Steve spent most of the first part of his career at SI as an assistant principal for academics. In that position he introduced renewable tenure for SI's teachers, guided academic departments toward excellence in the classroom and steered SI into coeducation.

Since 1989, Steve has overseen SI's Genesis III Campaign, \$16 million for major campus renovations; the Genesis IV Campaign, \$50 million in endowment for campus maintenance, faculty development and financial assistance; and our current Genesis V Campaign, \$50 million for capital improvements and additional financial assistance endowment – in all, more than \$100 million in fundraising efforts. His work and his legacy will speak for itself.

In a year when many of SI's pillars for the past 30 years have retired or have stepped down from positions of institutional leadership – Br. Draper, Steve Lovette, Charlie Dullea, Nick and Janet Sablinsky – we know these Ignatians cannot be replaced. Those of us who humbly assume their positions do so as stewards of the tremendous work they have set before us.

As Ignatians we know that since 1855, through our many successes and even our failures, SI has been guided and inspired by a spirit, *the Spirit*, which makes the SI experience unique. It is a spirit that guided Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, that lives in Thomas Brady '31 (one of our oldest graduates), and that gives hope to the first generation Ignatians of the class of 2012.

AP TESTS

SI has one of the largest AP programs in the country, giving more than 1,200 tests per year. The pass rate is consistently high. SI also looks at the AP performance of each graduating class over their four years. The Average Number of Tests taken by each class is a measure of the academic rigor of the school. It is comparable to the Challenge Index used by *Newsweek* to name the top 100 public high schools. SI has shown a marked and steady increase in this area over the past 17 years, tripling the average number of tests while maintaining an excellent pass rate.

Overall Pass Rate: In 2008, all students took a total of 1,366 tests and passed 976 with a pass rate of 71.4.

- Should receive a favorable recommendation from the principal, teacher, or counselor of the school the student now attends. (Note: This recommendation will be solicited by the Admissions Office.)
- Should perform well enough on the entrance examination to indicate that he or she is capable of achievement in a rigorous college preparatory course of study.
- The student and parents should be committed to the student's active participation in the religious and extracurricular activities of the community he or she seeks to join. This includes a genuine interest in after school activities, liturgies, retreats and community service.





Philip F. O'Connor '50, Famed Novelist

PHILIP F. O'CONNOR '50, an acclaimed writer of fiction, died Aug. 18 after suffering congestive heart failure. He was 75.

Two of O'Connor's six works of fiction – *Finding Brendan* (1991) and *Defending Civilization* (1988) – were nominated for Pulitzer Prizes. His novel *Stealing Home* (1979) was nominated in the First Novel category of the American Book Awards and was an alternate Book-of-the-Month-Club selection; it also earned for him the Nancy Dasher Award as Best Ohio Fiction Writer of the Year.

He served as a Pulitzer Prize judge in both 1985 and 1989; he and two other judges read 200 novels each time, and their recommendations led the Pulitzer committee to award top honors to *Lonesome Dove* in 1985 and *The Mambo Kings Play Songs of Love* four years later.


Born in 1932, he attended SI and USF where he attended his first creative writing class. There he met a teacher who influenced him "because he was such a bad teacher," O'Connor said in a 1991 *Genesis III* interview.

"He taught me by opposite example. He had all the trappings of a writer. He looked and sounded like a writer, but he didn't write. And all he cared about in a student's paper was the plot, not the characters or situations."

O'Connor knew he could do better, but he would wait until he got out of the Army before he tried his hand at writing. He joined ROTC at SI and USF and received his commission the day he graduated. He served in England, where he manned sophisticated anti-aircraft guns. "They were so sophisticated that they didn't work. If the Russians had attacked, we wouldn't have been able to do a thing about it."

O'Connor recounted those experiences 15 years later in his novel *Defending Civilization*, whose protagonist, 2nd Lt. Thomas V. Hanlon, is a graduate of SI and USF. Hanlon, said O'Connor, wrestled with moral dilemmas just as he learned to wrestle with ethical situations his Jesuit teachers presented to him.

After he left the Army, O'Connor returned to the Bay Area and worked as a reporter for *The San Francisco News*. He left journalism after a short stint with the paper because he didn't want



his life "determined by someone who might have shot his wife that morning."

He taught English at Riordan for four years and enrolled at SFSU where he wrote short stories and earned his master's degree in English before attending the famed University of Iowa's creative writing department.

In 1967 he began teaching at Bowling Green State University in Ohio and helped to create master's and doctoral programs in creative writing there. The university later named him a "distinguished professor" – the fourth instructor in the school's history to earn that title.

In 1971, he wrote *Old Morals, Small Continents, Darker Times*, which won the Iowa School of Letters Award for short fiction. The book went through three printings, unusual for a collection of short stories. His story "The Gift Bearer" was selected for publication in the *Best American Short Stories*.

His work earned critical praise. Webster Schott in the *New York Times Book Review* wrote that *Stealing Home* "is a novel of wondrous surfaces and startling depths ... as American as baseball and adultery in the suburbs ... as European as Sartre's conviction that everything has been figured out but how to live."

In 1994 he left Bowling Green to return to Marin, which was the setting for many of his stories.

He is survived by his children – Dondi, John, Chris, Erin, Justin, Ingrid and Hanlon – and by siblings Msgr. Jack O'Connor and Peggy Vollert. §

Thomas Carroll '43, Christ the King Recipient

THOMAS J. Carroll '43, a recipient of the Christ the King Award from SI and a close confidant of Rev. Harry Carlin, S.J. '35, died following a fall in his home July 31 on the feast of St. Ignatius, the saint he most admired. He was 82.

Born Oct. 25, 1925, to Thomas Carroll and Bridget Shea, Mr. Carroll was a native of San Francisco. After graduating from St. Paul's Grammar School and SI, he served in the U.S. Navy during WWII and attended USF and St. Mary's College before marrying Peg McAuliffe in 1949. He counted as a great blessing the loving community of the extended Healy-McAuliffe clan into which he was welcomed and in which he was treasured all through his life.

Tom followed his father into the SFFD, retiring as a battalion chief in 1980. He never outgrew his passion for the department and for his fire fighting vocation. Whenever he went on vacation, he would make a point of visiting nearby fire stations and befriending the firefighters there.

Tom served SI in a host of ways. He sent his two sons to the school and was a member of the SI Alumni Board, the Board of Regents and the Fr. Carlin Heritage Society. He spent his off-hours as a firefighter driving Fr. Carlin as he visited parents and other potential benefactors while fund-raising for the new SI campus.

"For 10 years, from 1965 to 1975, Fr. Carlin and I would leave SI around 9 a.m. and head for downtown to begin a full day of visits," said Mr.

Carroll in a 2004 interview. "Fr. Carlin had great success in these fund-raising efforts because he was so personable and friendly. It was my great pleasure to spend those days with him. We enjoyed lots of good conversation, and he was like a father and brother to me. I am very fortunate to be able to call him my good friend."

For his service to SI, and for his great love of the Church and the Society of Jesus, the school bestowed upon him the Christ the King Award in 1974.

Tom also was an enthusiastic member of and daily communicant at St. Gabriel Parish since 1954.

Tom is survived by his wife, Peg, and their children — Rev. Tom Carroll, S.J. '68, Cathy Carroll, Kevin (Kathy) Carroll '72, and Peggy (Jim) O'Donnell; their grandchildren Tom, Steve and Brendan Carroll and Patrick O'Donnell '04, Danny O'Donnell '06 and Sean O'Donnell '12; and their nephew Dan (Ann) Selmi ('68 Bellarmine).



CHRIS MATTHEWS, a Philadelphia native, attended the College of the Holy Cross, the first Jesuit College in New England, and served as a presidential speechwriter for four years during the Carter Administration.

He later worked as a print journalist for 15 years, spending 13 years as Washington, D.C., bureau chief for *The San Francisco Examiner* (1987–2000) and two years as a nationally syndicated columnist for *The San Francisco Chronicle*.

In addition to hosting *Hardball*, Matthews is also the host of *The Chris Matthews Show*, a syndicated weekly program produced by NBC News and distributed by NBC Universal Television Distribution. He is also a regular commentator on NBC's *Today* show.

For his professionalism, he received in 2004 the David Brinkley Award for Excellence in Broadcast Journalism, the Abraham Lincoln Award from the Union League of Philadelphia, and, in 2005, the Gold Medal Award from the Pennsylvania Society.

He is the author of five books on history in politics – *Hardball: How Politics is Played*; *Kennedy and Nixon: The Rivalry That Shaped Postwar America*; *Now Let Me Tell You What I Really Think*; *American: Beyond Our Grandest Notions*; and *Life's a Campaign: What Politics Has Taught Me About Friendship, Rivalry, Reputation, and Success*.
