



## **IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS**

### **HEPATITIS B**

#### **Early Childhood**

- Series of 3 doses must be completed prior to school entrance.

#### **Sixth Grade**

- Must show evidence of having received 3 doses of vaccine.

### **D.P.T. (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Whooping Cough)**

#### **Early Childhood**

- Three doses of DTP or DTaP by 1 year of age. One additional booster dose by 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday.

#### **Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> Grade**

- Four or more doses, the last being a booster received prior to school entrance, on or after 4<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- Individual doses in the series must have been received no less than four weeks apart (28 days).

#### **Sixth Grade**

- Entering 6<sup>th</sup> grade, for students  $\geq$  age 11, one dose of Tdap.

#### **Other Grades**

- Three or more doses of DTP/DtaP or TD; with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday.

### **POLIO**

#### **Early Childhood**

- Two doses by 1 year of age. One additional dose by 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday.

#### **Kindergarten and 1st Grade**

- Starting school year 2017-2018 any child entering Kindergarten shall show proof of 4 dose series with the last dose on or after the 4th birthday. **(This is a progressive requirement.)**

#### **Other Grades**

- Three or more doses of polio vaccine with the last dose on or after the 4th birthday.  
**(\*note that starting in 2017-2018 a progressive rule change)**

### **MEASLES**

#### **Early Childhood**

- 1 dose administered on or after 1<sup>st</sup> birthday.

#### **Kindergarten and Older**

- Two doses; the first administered on or after 1 year of age; the second no less than 4 weeks (28 days) later.

### **RUBELLA**

#### **Early Childhood**

- 1 dose administered on or after 1<sup>st</sup> birthday.

#### **Kindergarten and Older**

- Two doses; the first administered on or after 1 year of age; the second no less than 4 weeks (28 days) later.

### **MUMPS**

#### **Early Childhood**

- 1 dose administered on or after 1<sup>st</sup> birthday.

#### **Kindergarten and Older**

- Two doses; the first administered on or after 1 year of age; the second no less than 4 weeks (28 days) later.

### **HAEMOPHILUS INFLUENZAE**

#### **Early Childhood**

- Proof of series, or children 24-59 months of age without the series will need proof of one Hib vaccination on or after 15 months of age.



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### VARICELLA (CHICKEN POX)

#### Early Childhood

- One dose on or after 1<sup>st</sup> birthday.

#### Kindergarten and Older

- Two doses of varicella; the first dose must have been on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday and the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose no less than 4 weeks (28 days) later.

### PNEUMOCOCCAL (PCV)

#### Early Childhood

- Proof of series, or children 24-59 months of age without primary series of PVC, will need proof of one PCV vaccination after 24 months of age.

### MENINGOCOCCAL

#### 6<sup>th</sup> Grade

- One dose required on or after 11<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Parents or legal guardians who are requesting a religious exemption to immunizations or examinations **must** use this form for students entering kindergarten, sixth or ninth grades.

A separate form must be used for **each child** with a religious exemption enrolled.

This form may not be used for exemptions from immunizations and/or examination for personal or philosophical reasons. Illinois law does not allow for such exemptions.

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
