Attendance Matters

Why attendance matters

Low attendance leads to gaps in learning that can be challenging to recover. Missing out on learning opportunities leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Children with poor attendance achieve less well in primary and secondary education. The Department for Education expects each school to promote good attendance and reduce absences by ensuring children have access to full-time education and by addressing patterns of absence.

ATTEND ACHIEVE SUCEED

Attendance Facts

- Being late 5 minutes each day, could mean your child misses 3½ days of learning each year.
- There are at least 175 non-school days annually.
- When attendance falls to 90%, this equates to one day off every fortnight. Over 100 hours of missed learning opportunities each year. We want children to be happy! When children are happy attendance increases, anxiety decreases, friendships are easier and progress in school improves.
- We believe that attendance improves when we work together. Please contact a member of the team if you would like further support.

Regular school attendance enables children to;

The main gate is open from 8.45 to allow your child access to the building in order to start school at 8.55. Once registered, children undertake very important phonics sessions each day and if these are missed it can have a detrimental affect on their academic progress.
