1.Attendance

4. Principal Swanson shared the district will provide approximately 1,000 computer device refresh, and since we won't need as many Lands Trust funds, he is proposing/suggesting to allow teachers to submit "want/need" requests for this upcoming year. Teachers would submit a request, and Community Council would approve or ask for more clarification if needed before approving. There will be approximately \$200,000.00 of money. He believes there will be approx.. \$40,000 of unallotted money.

All requests will be a one-year request and must tie into one of the school goals.

5. SEL Follow-up-Mr. Swanson shared he wants to send some surveys out. The Facebook survey does not address "Summit" issues. He wants to send a survey that is more clarifying. He was very clear that if there are concerns, we want to address them.

Principal Swanson gave a brief overview of how we want to tie Citizenship in with Habits of Success/Portrait of a Graduate. More information will be coming soon.

2. Mr. Sims reviewed the graduation rates. A drop in graduation rates could be affected by no longer being allowed to have parents sign the Compulsory Ed form where parents take responsibility for their student's education.

Mr. Sims proposes to continue with a graduation rate of 97% or higher. It was asked about counselors working with students in danger of dropping out. Mr. Smith shared some of the resources and strategies to use help them be successful in school. Workshops, meeting, summer school, sel techniques, hope squad, next year a "Why Try" type program.

ACT scores-Mr. Sims shared ACT scores from last year. The growth was highest in district at .8 and still overall composite was highest in the district.

Mr. Sims proposes ACT score goal and one to one stays the same.

Mr. Sims shared we had no Certificate of Completions and that last year we had 133 students get a medallion for completion of pathways.

Mr. Stringfellow asked a question about Catalyst and what the plan is. The admin team is heading over to Catalyst today and will start looking at how to work together.

Mr. Swanson talked about the difference between Pathway and Letter of Completion

Mr. Stringfellow suggested that goals remain broad in order to make changes.
