School Improvement Plan Proposed Goals:

1. Propose to keep the 1:1 technology use, based on ACT practice and statewide test results.
2. Graduation rate of 97%-may see a drop but based on several factors affecting the whole state. There is no longer the ability to have parents sign a Home School Exemption form when they pull their students out of school
3. Increase CTE Pathway and Certification of Completion rates by 20%

The council was asked to look and ponder on those goals between now and the next meeting. Different thoughts, considerations, proposals are welcomed by the council.

Budget:

Principal Swanson reported approximately a \$47K carry over giving approximately \$300K for the 2022-2023 school year. Next month, the council will hear the wants and needs of teachers seeking monies to help with their individual student programs.

Staffing increases for the 2022-2023 school year.

ACT: Mr. Griffith reported it will be interesting to see the results of ACT over the next few years. There is a decrease in the use of ACT in regards to College admission acceptance rates. Principal Swanson reported that scholarships are still dependent on ACT scores. Mr. Sims spoke to the practice ACT results from the February test that just took place. From the first practice test in November to the second practice test in February, the cumulative score increased 1.2 points from 20.8 to 22.0. The largest growth was in Math and English, with a growth score of 2.1 and 2.3 respectively.
