





INFO ABOUT THE STRASBURG COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

The Carpenter's Cupboard Food Pantry, Strasburg's Community Food Pantry housed in the Strasburg United Methodist Church, is open for food distribution the **third Thursday** of every month from 9:00 – 11:30 a. m. and 5:30 – 7:30 p.m. Eligibility to shop is based on the income guidelines for the Federal and State Funded Food Programs and are as follows:

HOUSEHOLD ELEGIBILITY GUIDELINES

This table shows yearly gross income for each family size. If your household income is at or below the income listed for the number of people in your household, you are eligible to receive food. This certification form is being completed in connection with the distribution of food from the state funded program and/or Federal assistance through The Emergency Food Assistance Program.

- an 878 area phone number **OR**
- a child/children enrolled in Strasburg Franklin School System

WHAT TO BRING EVERY TIME:

1. Photo I. D.
2. Current original bill or bank statement (no copies)-We will check for your name and address. This is your proof of residency.
3. Please bring your boxes (that you are given when you first shop) back each month you come to shop.

Here are the shopping dates for the rest of 2017: **June 15, July 20, August 17, September 21, October 19, November 16 and December 21.** We will pass out a calendar with each month's distribution marked for you. There will be magnets on the back so you can stick it on your refrigerator.
