

### Social Justice Academy

Strasburg's Social Justice team continues to grow in numbers and gain knowledge as students continue to attend Academy days and learn about Social Justice. Co-teacher coordinators Casey Rife and Mary Fierbaugh have been attending events and working with the students through this program.

### Project Lead the Way

Project Lead the Way (PLTW), which is a national leading provider of K-12 STEM programs, continues here at Strasburg. Mr. Rauckhorst's Introduction to Engineering Design (IED) class is busy learning engineering processes and standards with hands-on projects. Teams of students and individual students are working to design solutions to a variety of problems. Students are empowered to find solutions to real world problems and will test and present those solutions in class as well as at a Showcase on May 10 at Buckeye Career Center. The plan is for this class of students to go on to Principles of Engineering next year.

The fourth and fifth-grade classes will be working on modules which started in January. Fourth grade will work on applying scientific ideas about using the conversion of energy to solve a simple design problem. The fifth graders will be working with robotics and automation. They will learn how to develop programming skills, including tablet applications and applying the robotic knowledge and skills to solve problems.

We hope to continue to build the program by adding both third grade and middle school next year. If you are interested in investing in Strasburg's students and the PLTW program with a donation, please contact the central office for the paperwork. The US Department of Commerce estimates that jobs in science and engineering will grow by double digit percentage in 2018 and beyond.

## Kindergarten Registration

Strasburg Elementary is excited to offer kindergarten registration packets beginning **Monday, February 26**. Packets may be picked up in the school office from 7:45 AM - 3:45 PM or on the evenings of February 22 and February 27 until 7:00 PM. Registration packets will also be available at the Strasburg Library.



**Kindergarten screening** will be held on **Thursday, April 19**. An appointment for screening can be made when the packet is picked up, or by calling the school office at 330-878-6503.

**Enrollment paperwork** (student's enrollment form and birth certificate, and the parent's proof of residency) must be completed and returned to the school by **Friday, March 23**. Any other paperwork can be returned on the day of screening. Computers will also be available on screening day for completion of Final Forms, an online data application that collects and stores registration information, such as emergency medical forms. Parents will receive more information regarding this service prior to screening via email

**Students must be five years old on or before August 1, 2018, to enroll in kindergarten.** Please contact Mrs. Demuth at 330-878-6503, ext. 3 with questions. We are eagerly awaiting the opportunity to welcome our newest Tigers into our school!


## Thank You Veterans!
