Strategic Planning Update to the Community

On May 2, 2019, the original committee for Strategic Planning met to review the goals and strategies established two years ago. The administrators reported out on progress made and items that remain to be established and completed.

The following items were reported as accomplishments:

- Adoption of a new Grade 3 English Language Arts curriculum
- Vertically aligned the K-5 writing expectations
- Adoption of the Grades 4 and 5 English Language Arts curriculum
- Adoption of the High School Algebra I and Geometry textbooks
- Scores have increased on the State Report Card
- Staff trainings in technology integration, differentiation, meeting the needs of exceptional students, qualities of gifted students, leveled questions and test development and formative assessments
- New technology equipment has been purchased through grants, donations and district funds
- Technology curriculum has been vertically aligned
- Project Lead the Way programs have been established and expanded
- At risk meetings are held bi-monthly by Grade 6-12 teachers
- Quarterly data meetings are held for Grades K-5
- MAP testing district-wide along with common assessments
- Foreign Language Club, Gaming Club, FCA and More Club and Social Justice has been created
- Parent Advisory Meetings for the Middle School/High School
- Safe Routes to School grant written and awarded in collaboration with the Village Council
- Alumnae Series introduced to the community



Strasburg HS Athletic Director to Serve as OIAAA Officer

Strasburg High School athletic administrator, **Gary Spinell**, has been selected to serve as an officer for the Ohio Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (OIAAA). He will begin his duties serving as secretary of the organization immediately filling the unexpired term of Ray Hibbs of Harrison Central High School, who stepped down in January. This coming November, Spinell will become the President-elect of the OIAAA and assume the position of president of the association beginning in November of 2021.

Spinell currently is in his sixth year as the athletic administrator for Strasburg-Franklin Local Schools, and is in his 26th overall year of education. He is a graduate of Claymont High School and received his undergraduate degree in Education at Kent State University and his Masters' in Education from Ashland University. He additionally serves as the Dean of Students, K-12, for Strasburg Schools.

In 2016, he was elected as a board member for the East District of the OHSAA and currently serves

He has earned his Certified Athletic Administrators (CAA) designation from the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (NIAAA) and his Certified Interscholastic Coach (CIC) certificate from the National Federation of High School Associations (NFHS).

Spinell launched the nationally recognized InSideOut Initiative with his athletic department coaches in 2017. Additionally, he helped Strasburg Schools become the first school district in Ohio to require all interscholastic athletic coaches to complete the Accredited Interscholastic Coach (AIC) program and become nationally certified coaches.

The OIAAA is currently the largest state interscholastic athletic directors' association in the country with nearly 800 members. The primary focus of the organization is the promotion of professional development for school athletic directors and the support of education-based interscholastic athletic programs for students.

Strasburg Elementary School Receives \$5,000 Grant

Lowe's Donates Money for Chrome Carts for Kids

We are thrilled to announce that Lowe's has awarded the Strasburg Elementary funding for the Chrome Carts for Kids. Our grant application was based on the goal of providing more technology to the students. We were able to purchase 30 chrome books as well as a chrome cart with charging stations.

The additional technology gives the students more opportunity for daily practice and to use programs and apps for classwork. The students also become more familiar with the keyboard which reduces anxiety for district and required state testing that are all performed on the chrome books. Strasburg Elementary was

able to purchase the additional cart and chrome books for the April and May testing period.

This was the third chrome cart that Strasburg Elementary purchased this year. The first was purchased with a donation from the Tiger Foundation and the second was through several anonymous donations from local businesses and individuals. Each chrome cart costs about \$7,400. With the additional chrome carts, each grade level now has its own cart and chrome books.

Hunger: the Bus Stops Here



The 20 buses weren't carrying students, but 29,000 pounds of food donations for the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank. The caravan, which departed from Faith Family Church, represented the culmination of the third annual "Hunger: The Bus Stops Here" food and fundraising drive that included school districts from Stark, Carroll, Summit, Tuscarawas and Wayne counties that are members of the Stark County Educational Service Center.



For the second year in a row, Lake Center Christian School collected the most food at more than 7,000 pounds. While not a member of the Stark County ESC, the school's principal, Jeff Knori, is a strong advocate for the Foodbank. The three Stark County ESC schools with the most donations were Dalton, Massillon and Minerva.

Coupled with financial contributions, the schools' efforts will help the Foodbank provide more than 41,000 meals to the community as part of the Foodbank's Harvest for Hunger campaign. Dan Flowers, president and chief executive officer of the Foodbank, said the agency is grateful for its partnership with the schools. "This collaboration is unique because so many school districts come together across county lines to support a unified cause: feeding people and fighting hunger," Flowers said. "In addition to food and financial donations, some districts send student representatives to help unload their donations. It's inspiring to see young people so invested in supporting their community."

Stark County ESC Superintendent Joe Chaddock said the Foodbank's work is important to many of the ESC's member school districts. "A lot of the food donations will wind up going right back to our kids," Chaddock said. "It is just another great thing that schools are doing to help their communities."

The largest demographic of people affected by hunger are children under the age of 18. In the Foodbank's eight-county service area, more than 20 percent of children are considered to be "food insecure," meaning they lack regular access to nutritional food for an active and healthy life.

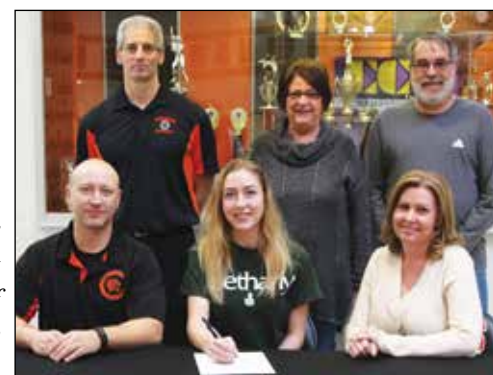
