1. Welcome
The meeting started at 4:30pm.
2. Approval of Last Meeting Minutes
Holly Dunham motioned to accept the last meeting minutes and Jerry Niles seconded the motion. The vote to accept the minutes was unanimous.
3. Return to Instruction/Continuity of Services (RIPICS) – public comment in consideration of any needed updates.
Dr. Pitts shared the RIPICS document and ESSER III. This plan was created and posted in July and must be updated every six months. It was updated in December, so Dr. Pitts shared the updated plan. (We discussed the updated RIPICS in previous SHAC meetings, as well.) Dr. Pitts gave time for questions about the RIPICS. There were no questions.
4. New Business/Reports
 - A. COVID Update:
**The last positive at the high school was Feb. 10. The last positive at the middle school was Feb. 7. The last positive at the intermediate was Feb. 14. The last positive at the elementary was Feb. 21.
There were more COVID tests bought for staff members who may need it.**
 - B. Child Nutrition:
**The district had to rebid for food service management because there is a new campus being built through our bond. Bids are due March 23, 2022.
Mary Ann Kimenski shared that there are 5 students participating in Future Chef. Supply chain shortages have not impacted the food items, but paper products at the elementary level have been difficult to get. They are giving fresh fruit and are using baggies to supplement the paper products.
Dr. Pitts shared that the free meals for students may not continue for next year. We are relying on the federal government to let districts know.**
 - C. Campus Safety:

The district purchased some new cameras to go in the Ag barn. Nurse Ellis and Chief Sanders have discussed adding Stop the Bleed to safety training for staff in the future.

D. Social Services Liaison:

a. Mental Health

- i. Cindy Davis said she met with PO's and with MHMR to start building those relationships for mental health purposes.
- ii. The district is hosting a Resource Fair in April for the community.
- iii. Bianca Martinez and Cindy Davis are working to create a youth mental health advisory board.

b. Parent Summits

- i. Sue Battle came to the Parent Summit in February.
- ii. Charlie Crocket will be at the April Parent Summit.
- iii. Chief Sanders asked if the judge could mandate truant cases to attend the Parent Summits and said she might mention it to him.

Dr. Pitts discussed that he will share with the board what the SHAC has done in the meetings this year. Jerry Niles asked if there is anything we might need as a district that could be discussed in a board meeting. Nurse Ellis shared that she would love to look at buying more tourniquets.
