TuitionNet Refund Insurance

Calculated at 2.65% of total tuition and fees
(excluding the ELL fee and International Student
Health Insurance). Required for families who elect to
pay tuition in installments through FACTS Tuition
Management. Recommended to all families.



Tuition and Enrollment Deposit

A non-refundable enrollment deposit of IO% of the billed tuition (after any applied financial aid) is required. The deposit is credited toward the total tuition due.

Program and Technology Fee

Assessed for all students and includes such services as: tech support, health services, science lab, required events, ID cards, student transportation and activities.

Tuition Refund Insurance Plan

Tuition refund insurance protects parents and the School. It is required of all families who do not choose payment Option A on the enrollment contract. It is highly recommended for all families.

Option A: Payment made in full by June I.

Option B: Payments made in two installments. First payment is 60% of tuition and fees. Remaining 40% paid within 6 months.

Option C: Ten monthly payments made from May through February.

Enrolling after May I:

Option A: Payment in full within 30 days.

Option B: First payment due within 30 days.

Option C: Past installments due within 30 days.

Music Major Fees*

Instrumental Students: Fee covers 30 private lessons and one NEC large ensemble.

Jazz Students: Fee covers 30 private lessons and one NEC large ensemble.

Composition Students: Fee covers 28 private lessons in composition.

Vocal Students: Fee covers 28 vocal and secondary instrument private lessons, vocal coaching and one large NEC ensemble.

*These fees do not cover additional NEC Classes/Ensembles or secondary lessons beyond that which is described here, nor do they fully cover lesson costs of a very small number of highly sought-after teachers.



Students of any major who wish to take private music instruction in voice, composition, or other instruments in addition to their major concentration may register for secondary lessons at the start of each semester for a fee in the range of \$1,000 to \$2,000 per semester.

Writing, Film & Media Arts Fee

Covers the use and maintenance of technology and equipment, digital media and other specialized supplies for the Writing, Film & Media Arts program, including the use of a laptop, with all program-related software, for the duration of their program.

English Language Learner (ELL) Program Fee

The ELL Fee is assessed for international students placed in English Language Learner classes. The ELL Program is designed to help non-native English speakers with coursework and provide the resources they need to succeed at Walnut Hill and beyond. Testing takes place during Orientation, and placement is determined in consultation with the ELL and World Languages faculty.

International Student Processing Fee

This fee covers a variety of programs and support systems designed to promote a healthy and easy transition to life here at Walnut Hill and in the United States as well as: F-I student visa support; SEVIS administration; new International Student Orientation; cultural adjustment support; and campus programs and events.

Personal Expenses

Typically, families will incur approximately \$30-\$50 per week in books and supplies during the school year. Additional expenses depend upon student needs and may include snacks, pointe shoes, paint, journals, tutoring, scripts, optional music or voice lessons, bow rosin, and other personal items.
