The program is fully youth-led with oversight from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor. Each year, 11 new students are selected for a two-year commitment to serve on the Council. **To be eligible for the program, applicants must be from 14 to 18 years of age and be in 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, or 10<sup>th</sup> grade.** Applicants are also required to submit one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, coach, mentor, or community leader. Counselors, flight instructors and professors are all leaders in aerospace education. Instruction will start with the basics of flying (which some of you may already know, but a refresher will be a good thing!) and progress to experiencing new and exciting technologies, and exploration of career opportunities in flight, air traffic control, aviation management, and unmanned aircraft systems(UAS). A passion for flight is a must for this particular camp, along with interest in attending UND in the future. Then do the following: Write an essay of a minimum of 500 words and address: (1) your passion for flight and aviation, along with your goals for pursuing a college and career pathway in aviation as a pilot, air traffic controller, aviation manager, or in the field of unmanned aircraft systems; (2) the experiences you have had related to your goals and the classes you have taken, or will take, that are preparing you for your future; (3) why you are interested in potentially attending UND in the future; and (4) anything further that you believe may enhance your application.
