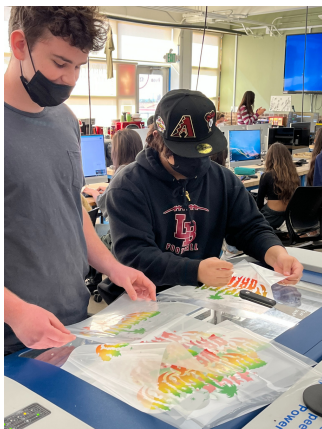

What happened in February?

Graphic Design Pathway

During February, students were working on diverse projects in all 3 courses in the Graphic Design Pathway. In the Multimedia Design Honors course, which is the concentrator course in this pathway, students were learning the process to take a design from conception to production. Students were creating a t-shirt design, crafting a transferable vinyl design, and using technology to adhere that vinyl design to a t-shirt. This is a multi-step process, requiring the use of several computer software programs and industry equipment to create the t-shirt design.

Our ROP, CCA, has released the CTE courses they will be offering for the 2022-23 school year. There are 3 new courses; Cybersecurity, Hotel Hospitality Careers, and Lifeguarding. Two of the after-school courses are offered on the LBHS campus; Emergency Medical Technician Honors & Medical Hospital Careers Honors. Numerous courses offered by CCA are Honors level, which provides a weighted GPA for students. Collaboration between the Dance & Visual/Commercial Arts Pathways

CTE courses provide students many opportunities to learn important 21st century skills, like creativity, innovation, critical thinking, and collaboration. These essential skills are important for students to be successful with their future college and career plans. In CTE courses, students learn from each other as they share their skills, knowledge, and training to complete projects. A collaborative project happened with two CTE Pathways this month.

Seniors in our Professional Dance Pathway participated in a photo shoot with our Visual/Commercial Arts students. Dance Pathway students are creating a visual display for the lobby of the Artists Theatre for their upcoming Spring Dance Concert. The theme of the concert is emotions. Each senior Dance student would demonstrate a different emotion through facial expressions. The photo shoot would capture each senior showing their representation of an emotion like, silly, sad, happy, shocked, etc.

Visual/Commercial Arts Pathway students photographed portraits of the Dance students showing a specific emotion. These images will be used in creating digital and traditional artworks. The Art Pathway students will use an analogous color scheme that corresponds to the color spectrum of each emotion. The Art students took the portraits in two different studios to provide different lighting and backgrounds.
