Rights

Legal Custody

A parent or guardian who has legal custody of a child and does not wish the other parent, parents, or persons to have access to the child should present the proper legal documents to the principal to establish custody rights. A parent or guardian who has gained custody of the student must present to the school legal documents before the student is permitted to enroll.

EERPA Statement of rights

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the district receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading. Parents or eligible students may ask the district to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the district decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the district will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- 3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the district has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the district discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. (NOTE: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the student of records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.) The following student directory information may be published or transmitted by Internet without prior parent consent:
 - Student's name, address, telephone, date and place of birth;
 - Student's participation in officially recognized activities, sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams;
 - Student's date of attendance, name of school, degrees and awards received;

Parents may request in writing that the above directory information not be published or transmitted by the school district.

4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the district to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA are:

The office of the Superintendent of Schools shall maintain the official FERPA policy.

Policies & Procedures

<u>ID Cards</u>: For the security of our students and staff, all Memorial High School **students must wear and display IDs at all times** when on school property. Failure to display an identification card may result in disciplinary action.

- ID cards and lanyards will be supplied to each student at the beginning of the year at no charge.
- ID cards will be required to attend school-sponsored activities such as football and basketball games.
- If a student forgets their ID badge, they can receive 1 temporary ID Card to wear for the day (1 per semester). If a student forgets it again, a replacement ID will need to be purchased for \$2.00.

Random Bag Searches: Random bag and person searches will be conducted 1-3 times per month.

<u>Closed Campus</u>: We are a closed campus. Students **cannot leave campus for any reason** unless a parent/guardian checks them out or they are enrolled in Tech or Concurrent Enrollment. Students leaving campus during the day will receive disciplinary action.

<u>Food Delivery Policy</u>: Students may not receive any food deliveries at any time during the day. Deliveries will be sent back to the restaurant. Any delivery driver on property will be asked to leave the campus. **Students ordering food will be subject to appropriate consequences.**

Students Opening Doors for Other Students or Visitors: All visitors AND Students must enter through the main doors at the front of the school. Students caught opening any door for a visitor OR OTHER STUDENTS will be subject to disciplinary action.

<u>Parking Permits</u>: All student and staff drivers must register their car with Campus Police and receive a Memorial High School Parking Permit. Cars without permits are subject to fines and/or towing at owner's expense. Students must park in the designated student parking lot.

<u>Dress Code</u>: Students are **required to be in dress code at all times** when on school property. Students out of dress code will be required to change clothing or will be placed in TRAICE for the remainder of the day.

(see dress code on next page)

<u>Hall Sweeps</u>: **Regular hall sweeps** will be conducted each week. If students get caught in a hall sweep, they will receive a verbal warning the first time and detention each additional time (per semester).

<u>Lunchtime Procedures</u>: Students must eat lunch in the designated areas- large cafeteria, small cafeteria, or breezeway. Students **may not go beyond the gate** by the large gym **during their lunch period** unless they have a pass or sticker from a teacher. Students may not eat or hangout in any other area of the building but the approved areas. **Students may not leave campus during lunch or order food.**

<u>Headphones/Ear buds</u>: Students must **only have one earbud in one of their ears** or one side of their headphones covering one of their ears before and after school, during passing periods and at lunchtime.

<u>Hall Passes</u>: Students are **not allowed in the hallway during class time without a pass**. Students in the hallway without a pass will receive appropriate consequences.

<u>Portable Speakers</u>: Portable speakers are not allowed to be played at any time during the day including lunchtime and in the hallways.

TRAICE: If a student is assigned TRAICE he or she will be **required** to do the following:

- Turn in cell phone to TRAICE teacher (phones will be returned at the end of 7th hour)
- Complete work in each subject in which they are enrolled
- Follow the rules in the TRAICE room or further action will be taken

<u>Tobacco/Vapes</u>: We have a "no tolerance" policy regarding the possession of or the use of tobacco or vapes and related paraphernalia. **Any student found in possession of or in use of tobacco or vapes and related paraphernalia will receive consequences** and TPS Campus Police or the Tulsa Police Department may be notified and a \$100.00 ABLE ticket may be issued.

<u>Alcohol and Illegal Substances</u>: We have a "no tolerance" policy regarding the possession or the use of alcohol or illegal substances and related paraphernalia. Any student **found in possession of or in use of alcohol or illegal substances will receive consequences** and TPS Campus Police or the Tulsa Police Department will be notified.

<u>Student Arrival</u>: School **doors will open at 8:00am** every morning. In case of inclement weather or if the temperature is below 40 degrees, doors will be opened at 7:45am. Students **arriving after 8:30am**, will need to get a **tardy slip** from Mrs. Rolland at the Attendance Desk.

Student Departure: All students **must be out of the building by 3:45pm**. Students will not be allowed in the building after 3:45pm unless they are with a teacher or coach.

Attendance: Students are expected to attend all classes, every day. A student with more than 9 absences per semester may lose credit for courses in which they are enrolled. In addition, students on transfers to Memorial may have their transfer revoked due to poor attendance. If a student must be absent for a valid reason, a parent or guardian must call the school or write a letter to explain the absence or the absence will be considered truancy and unexcused.

<u>Tardies:</u> Students will **receive consequences after their 5**th **tardy**. Consequences can include detention, student and parent conference, TRAICE and/or referral.

<u>Make-Up Work</u>: Students with **excused absences** will have the **same number of days they were absent to turn in make-up work** (if a student is absent 2 days, he or she will have 2 school days to turn in make-up work). Students are responsible for getting and completing their make-up work.

Classroom Detention Policy: Teachers may give detention for the following offenses:

- Tardies
- Inappropriate dress
- Failure to wear ID
- Inappropriate use of cell phone
- Disrespect
- Failure to follow classroom rules
- Skipping/cutting

<u>Detention Process</u>: **Teachers will follow the steps below** before a detention or referral is written. Detention is held on Tuesdays and Thursdays before and after school.

- 1. Verbal warning
- 2. Student Conference in hallway
- 3. Parent Contact
- 4. Detention assigned with parent contact
- 5. PowerSchool Referral

Hallway Behavior:

- Walk to the right of the hallways and do not block traffic by standing in groups.
- **Do not run** in the hallways.
- **Do not congregate** in the halls, locker areas, or commons areas area between classes.
- Do not scream or yell in the hallways.
- All stairwells located throughout the building are **monitored by cameras at all times**, do not sit on the stairs or congregate in stairwells.
- Students not following appropriate hallway behavior may receive disciplinary action.

<u>Library Procedures</u>: All students **must have a pass from a staff member to go to the library** during class time. The library is closed daily during 4th hour unless students are with their teacher. The library is open during both lunches but students must obtain a library sticker to go to the library at lunchtime (see Ms. Jones in the library).

Skateboards/Roller Blades: Skateboards and/or roller blades are not permitted at school.

<u>Search and Seizure</u>: Students have no right of privacy towards school staff in the contents of their lockers, desk or other school property. If there is reasonable suspicion, **TPS has the authority** to detain, search, or authorize the search of any student or property in the possession of the student for weapons, substances, intoxicating beverages, wireless devices, or stolen property.

<u>Cell Phones</u>: It is our expectation that students engage and participate in their own learning. To be fully engaged, students **should not have their cell phones out during class time**. Students with their cell phones out in class without specific permission from their teacher will be subject to the detention process listed previously. Students will be allowed to use their cell phones before and after school, in between classes, and at lunch.

<u>Deliveries for Students</u>: **Deliveries of gifts, flowers, balloons, etc. is discouraged**. Deliveries will be kept in the Main Office until the end of the day for the student.

<u>Vending Machines</u>: Vending machines **can be used** before and after school, during passing period, and at lunchtime.

<u>Prescription/Non-prescription Medication</u>: All **medication must be checked into the school nurse**, Mrs. Rogers. Written parental permission must be on file before a student can take the medicine. Students may not carry prescriptions or over-the-counter drugs on their person.

<u>Visitors</u>: All **visitors must enter through the main doors** at the front of the school and check in at the Attendance Desk or Main Office with a valid ID. Students caught **opening any door for a visitor** will be subject to disciplinary action.

<u>Check-Out Procedures</u>: Parents/guardians must **come to the Attendance Desk to check out students** and have a Valid ID. Only adults listed on the student's PowerSchool page can check students out of school.

Important Student Information

<u>Lunch Forms</u>: School lunch forms are due to the main office by October 1st, 2022. All students are expected to turn in a school lunch form even if they do not qualify for free or reduced lunch. If a student does qualify for free or reduced lunch and does not turn in his or her form by October 1st, they will be charged full price for breakfast and lunch including all the breakfast and lunches students received since the beginning of the year. Lunch forms can be completed online or on paper. Paper copies can be obtained in the main office.

<u>Lockers</u>: Individual lockers are provided for all students. **Locker assignments will be given by 1st hour teachers**. Locks are highly encouraged, and the combination should be given to their 1st hour teacher.

Work Permit for Students 14 or 15 years of Age: For students 14 or 15 years of age that want to get a job, they must **obtain a work permit from Mrs. Anderson in the Main Office**. To receive a work permit, students must have good attendance according to the State Department of Education's guidelines.

<u>Driver's Permit</u>: Driver's **Permits can only be obtained from the TPS Enrollment Center** with these requirements:

<u>PowerSchool Passwords</u>: Student PowerSchool passwords can be obtained in the Main Office.

<u>Grade Point Average (GPA)</u>: The **standard 4-point grading system** (A-4, B-3, C-2, D-1, F-0) will be used calculating the GPA on all student transcripts. Students who take **Advanced Placement** courses and **Concurrent Enrollment** (AP classes and college classes) will use a **5-point grading system** (A-5, B-4, C-3).

<u>Counselors</u>: Each student is **assigned a counselor based on the first letter of the student's last name**. Counselors are divided alphabetically in the following way:

- A-G: Mr. Ronning (Main Office)
- H-O: Mrs. Johnson (Main Office)
- P-Z: Mrs. Kerpan (Main Office)

<u>Social Worker</u>: Mrs. Green is our **school-based social worker** and is located in an office above the Attendance Desk.

<u>Tulsa Technology Center</u>: Students interested in attending Tulsa Technology Center during their junior and senior year, must **complete the application during their sophomore year**. Students should see their counselor for more information.

Memorial High School Dress Code

It is hoped that a minimum amount of time is spent on enforcement of dress code. It is the responsibility of the student and the parent/guardian to follow the dress code.

"Armpits to Fingertips, No Skin Showing."

The school has the authority to decide the appropriateness of any clothing/accessory.

Dress Code Violations:

Students out of dress code will be required to <u>change</u> clothing or will be placed in TRAICE for the remainder of the day and parent contact will be made.

- This includes hoods/hats worn on student's head.
- Zipping/Buttoning up a jacket is not considered "changing" clothes when wearing an inappropriate top.

Continued dress code violations will result in additional days of TRAICE and a parent/guardian meeting to complete a student success plan.

Graduation Terms to Know

<u>ICAP</u>: The State Department of Education requires all graduating classes from 2023 and on to complete an Individualized Career Academic Plan (ICAP) to graduate. ICAP will be completed during advisory classes.

<u>Personal Financial Literacy (PFL)</u>: State law requires that **all students complete PFL** online or in a class **to graduate**. Login instructions can be obtained from Mr. Vestal in the Main Office.

<u>CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation)</u>: The State Department of Education requires that **all students complete CPR training to graduate**.

<u>FAFSA</u>: All seniors should go online to studentaid.gov and complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid to determine their eligibility to receive financial aid to go to college or university.

<u>Tulsa Achieves</u>: The **Tulsa Achieves Scholarship** program through Tulsa Community College will **pay up to 100% of tuition and fees** for students living in Tulsa County and graduating from a public or private high school. For more information, contact your counselor.

Oklahoma's Promise: With Oklahoma's Promise, students who meet certain criteria can earn **free college tuition** at an Oklahoma public 2-year college or 4 year university. To qualify, students must apply during their 8th, 9th, or 10th grade year. For more information, contact your counselor or go to www.okpromise.org.

Student Incentives and Fun
