



### **Credits**

- You receive credits for each class you pass with a D or higher
- Each semester class is worth 5 credits
- You must have 230 credits to graduate
- If you receive a D or F in a core academic course, you will need to recover the class in summer school.










## What are A-G Requirements?

- Sequence of high school courses
- Required for freshmen entering the UC, CSU, and some Private Universities
- Must be pass classes with a grade of 'C' or higher



#### **Class Levels: Honors and Advanced Placement**

- Classes cover advanced materials and have more in-depth study
- Grade is "weighted" when students receive an A,B, or C
   Example: A 'C' in an AP course is equivalent to a 'B' in a non-AP course.
- AP= College level class, culminating in a rigorous exam (opportunity to earn college credit)
- Strong study habits





## State Seal of Biliteracy

The State Seal of Biliteracy (SSB), marked by a gold seal on the diploma, recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing one or more languages in addition to English.



#### ELIGIBILITY 11th grade ELA CAASPP with Standard Met or Above \*If 11th grade ELA CAASPP scores are not available, a local standards-based assessment can Requirement E Complete four years of English with an overall GPA of 2.0 or above Requirement C **Demonstrate** proficiency in a language other than English through ONE of the following methods: Pass a World Language Advanced Placement exam with a minimum score of a 3 Pass the International Baccalaureate examination with a minimum score of a 4 Pass the SAT II World Language Exam with a score of 600 or higher Successfully complete a four-year course of study (equivalent to taking level 4 or higher) in world language with a minimum GPA average of 3.0 AND passing an Oral Exam If you currently take the ELPAC Requirement D **Demonstrate** proficiency on the English Language Proficiency Assessment California (ELPAC) \*Students taking Latin, or qualifying students of languages not taught at TUSD, will complete an alternate assessment.






