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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Spring is here and we are moving forward to the end of 3rd quarter. As the weather begins to warm, this is a good time to remind our North Point family of several things:

- Please remember that head coverings, including baseball caps and hoods, mid-drift tops, tank tops, shorts/skirts that rise above mid-thigh are prohibited by the CCPS dress code. The full-dress code can be reviewed on pages 12-13 at [CodeofConduct20212022.pdf \(finalsite.net\)](#)
- We would also like to remind everyone for safety reasons, that students and parents are prohibited from ordering food to be delivered to the school through any food delivery service (i.e. Uber Eats). Delivery drivers will be instructed to return the food to the business. North Point High School is not responsible for money lost when delivery is denied. Students are not to leave class and/or meet delivery drivers in the parking lots or on Davis Road.
- If a student forgets their lunch, please be reminded that breakfast and lunch are free for all students this school year. Only a parent/guardian may drop off lunch in the main office for their child. Due to allergies and food restrictions, parents/guardians may not drop off food for their child's friends or other students. Please note that food being dropped off cannot be refrigerated or kept warm. Students are not permitted to pick up food from the main office until their assigned lunch time.
- Students are reminded that they are expected to be in class before the late bell rings. Parents, please encourage your child to be on time for all classes. We are noticing an increase in car riders and student drivers arriving late in the morning. Please be reminded that 1st block begins at 8:05. Car riders and drivers arriving after 8:05 must check-in through the main office. Students must also check-out in the main office for all early dismissals. Parents are reminded that only individuals on the emergency card are permitted to pick up a student and only with parent permission. When picking up a student the individual must present picture identification.
- All teachers continue to provide academic support and reassessment opportunities during our daily NEST time. Parents, please encourage your child to take full advantage of these opportunities. Feel free to reach out to your child's teachers or counselor if you have questions or concerns about your child's academic progress or participation in NEST opportunities.

JROTC CADET LEADERSHIP COURSE

North Point High School JROTC will hold their annual JROTC Cadet Leadership Course (CLC) from 27 June – 1 July 2022. CLC is an introductory JROTC program designed to give students a sampling of JROTC activities and a jump-start on the school year. The program is open to all in-coming high school students, but is highly recommended for students who are considering taking JROTC in the coming school year.

A typical day will include light physical fitness, drill and ceremony, and classroom instruction on topics such as leadership fundamentals, goal setting, time management, and being a successful student. Field trips are also a big part of the program and will be scheduled throughout the week. The training will start each morning at 7:30 am and end at 4:00 pm. Optional gym time or group activity time will be available 4:00 to 6:00 pm. Instructors will be on-site for drop-off as early as 6:00 am each morning.

The cost for CLC is \$150.00 per cadet. This fee covers lunch and a snack each day, CLC uniform items, and field trip transportation. Transportation to and from NPHS is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. Space is limited (first-come-first-serve), so get your spot reserved as soon as possible, no later than 27 May 2022. PROM INFORMATION

Prom is April 30th from 7:00 pm to 11:00 pm at Martin's Crosswinds in Greenbelt, Maryland.

Tickets will be on sale during lunches April 4 - 8 (\$90) and April 11 - 14 (\$95)

School debts must be paid (including senior dues and laptop damage fees) before purchasing a ticket.

Juniors and seniors that plan to take a guest to the prom that does not attend North Point will need to submit a prom guest form. The prom guest form can be picked up in the main office. COMPLETED GUEST FORMS MUST BE TURNED INTO THE NORTH POINT MAIN OFFICE BY NOON ON FRIDAY APRIL 1. Late guest forms will not be accepted.

- Juniors and seniors may only purchase a maximum of two tickets (for self and up to 1 guest)
- Only juniors and seniors may purchase tickets to the prom. 9th and 10th grade students may only attend the prom as the guest of a NPHS junior or senior.
- All attendees must present their ticket upon arrival at the venue.
- 9th & 10th graders attending prom as the guest of a junior or senior must arrive with and check in with the junior or senior who purchased the ticket.
- All approved outside guests must present photo identification AND a ticket AND arrive with the NPHS junior or senior who purchased the ticket.
- Prom attendees may not leave the venue and return. Once an attendee exits the building, he/she will not be permitted to reenter the prom.
- Parents/guardians/family/friends may not enter the prom venue to take photographs.
- Prom will end promptly at 11:00 pm All rides (parents/limos) must be at the venue promptly by 11:00 pm.
- Appropriate formal attire must be worn. Parents and students may read the approved CCPS formal wear dress code on page 12-13 at [CodeofConduct20212022.pdf \(finalsite.net\)](#).
- Prom is an official CCPS event. Students and their guests are expected to follow all rules and expectations as outlined in the in the CCPS Code of Conduct.
- The prom venue employs security and will have police officers on site.
