Freshmen and Sophomores: The Legislative Youth Advisory Council (LYAC) is a statewide leadership development and civic education program for students. LYAC empowers young leaders to learn about and engage directly with the legislative process through education and advocacy. The council is responsible for adopting a legislative agenda, meeting with legislators and testifying on bills, and organizing educational forums for young people throughout the state encouraging them to get involved. The program is fully youth-led with oversight from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor. Each year, 11 new students are selected for a two-year commitment to serve on the Council. **To be eligible for the program, applicants must be from 14 to 18 years of age and be in 8th, 9th, or 10th grade.** Applicants are also required to submit one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, coach, mentor, or community leader. [Applications](#) and [letters of recommendations](#) are due by **April 14th, 2022**. Recommenders may submit a letter on behalf of an applicant or students may use a previous letter of recommendation as well.
