Title 1 School Wide Parent Involvement Policy

child's progress, and working with educators. Information will be provided during an annual fall meeting, through quarterly progress notices, at parent-teacher conferences, in the district newsletter, and on the district website.

- Providing materials, resources and training to help parents work with their children to improve academic achievement.
- Communicating regularly with parents in clear and understandable terms. This would include opportunities for parents to participate through volunteer opportunities, bi-annual Title I Parent Meetings, newsletters, parent surveys, and parentteacher conferences. Parent-teacher meetings will be scheduled at any time, as requested by parents.
