Peanut Butter Cookie Recipe



Ingredients

1 cup of peanut butter

1 cup of white sugar

1 egg

Preparation

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. Mix peanut butter, sugar, and egg together in a bowl using an electric mixer until smooth and creamy. Roll mixture into small balls and arrange on baking sheet; flatten each with a fork, making a crisscross pattern.
3. Bake in the preheated oven for 10 minutes. Cool cookies on the baking sheet for 2 minutes before moving to a plate.

Fun Facts about Spring

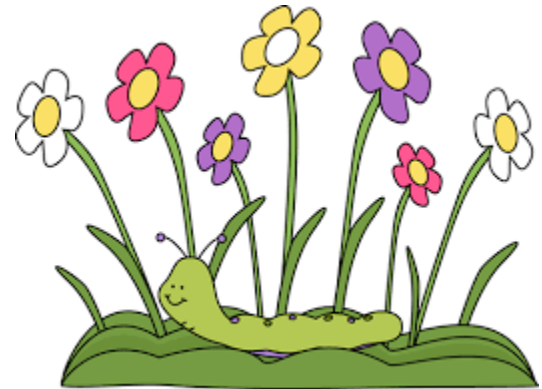
- Spring is the season between winter and summer.
