

The Family Resource Center is responsible for the following action components (as established by KERA, 1990) and a directory of services the FRC has developed to meet those components. Below is a list of the components and what services that I have experience in.

When other agencies provide a direct service, the Family Resource Center will work with and/or refer to that agency.

### **After School Child Care (ages 4-12)**

Refer to Eastern Kentucky Child Care Coalition, Informational packets sent home with parents

### **Preschool Child Care (ages 2 & 3)**

Referrals to Eastern Kentucky Child Care Coalition, Referrals to Preschool (3 year olds);  
Informational packets sent home to parents

### **Family Literacy**

Sponsor Parenting Classes, GED classes, Computer classes, Collaboration and referrals to the Adult Learning Center; Collaborate with RIF program; Family Reading/Family Fun Nights; Family Resource Center Lending Library; Parental informational packets sent home

### **Health Services/ Referrals to Health and Mental Health Services**

On-site mental health services through local mental health providers; Part-time health care from district school nurse; Collaboration with local mental health providers (service team meetings); Dental Health Month Activities; Referrals to "Make a Child Smile" program; Referrals to "Sight for Students" program; Referrals to local mental health providers, Impact and Impact Plus services; Collaboration with local providers as resources; Drug and Alcohol awareness programs (Red Ribbon Week); Center sponsored anger management support group; Referrals to area physicians and specialists as needed; Hygiene and Puberty Class; LIGHT Program implementation;

### **Families in Training**

Certified Parents As Teachers Facilitator; Home visits to new and expectant parents; Referrals to community supportive resources; Collaborate with local resources to provide parenting classes; Referrals to HANDS program (Health Dept.); Maintain lending library for new and expectant parents; Informational packets sent home with students as directed by needs survey

### **Educational Support and Enrichment**

Holiday assistance through Guardian Angel Tree program, Shop with a Cop program, Area Churches; Back to School Extravaganza; Clothing assistance through grant funds, clothing closet and referrals to Baptist Clothing Mission, God's Helping Hands and Goodwill; Collaboration with local resources to maintain food bank; Feud for Food Drive; Clothing and Coat drives; Red Ribbon Week activities; Maintaining and training parent and community volunteers; Referrals to and collaboration with community emergency need resources (God's Food Pantry; God's Helping Hands; Pulaski

Emergency Relief Ministry; St. Mildred's Outreach); Collaboration with DCBS for continuity of services; Referrals to summer camps and activities; Coordinate 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Transition Day during academy week; Assist with implementing Character Education program; Facilitate Comprehensive Family Services meetings with families on attendance/issues; Home visits to address issues between home and school; Host Grandparent Support Group for grandparents raising their grandchildren
