## ADULT/COMMUNITY EDUCATION

The Board <u>will-may</u> establish and maintain a program of adult education and may utilize any of its school facilities for accomplishing the legitimate educational purposes of serving the vocational, avocational, cultural, and aesthetic interests of the community.

The Board <u>will\_may</u> also <u>maintain\_offer</u> a program of instruction in English language and in government and laws for the benefit of foreign-born residents of the district as required by community interest.

In order to support a program of adult education and education for the foreign born, the Board may employ staff, use school facilities as required, and provide necessary custodial services. All professional staff members so employed shall possess valid New Jersey teaching certificates.

The Superintendent is directed to seek out and utilize such federal, state, and private sources of revenue as may be appropriate for the financial support of the adult education program.

The program of adult school education shall be maintained at no cost to the Board of Education. Participating individuals shall be charged tuition pursuant to law and shall provide all supplies necessary to the accomplishment of the program. Exception to tuition shall be made for residents of the district who are 62 years of age or older, who shall be admitted to one course per semester free or for a reduced fee. Such residents must offer proof of age and residency upon registration. The Board reserves the right to offer certain courses where this discount may not apply.

All out-of school youths and adult residents of this district and neighboring districts—and presently enrolled students in the secondary school of this district – are eligible for attendance in the adult education program.
