**A – VISION 2030: FINANCE & INFRASTRUCTURE**

**Discussion Item: Committee Report**

FINANCE

1. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to approve the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 for submission as follows:

**WHEREAS**, during the public hearing held on May 7, 2019, the Board of Education discussed the 2019-2020 School District Budget and provided opportunity for public comment on it then and at each Board of Education meeting where the Board discussed the 2019-2020 Budget from December 18, 2018 through March 19, 2019; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2019-2020 School District Budget requires the use of Emergency Reserve Funds for school security improvements in the amount of \$250,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2019-2020 School District Budget requires the use of Capital Reserve Funds for capital outlay improvements in the amount of \$630,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the school district policy (Expenses - #9250) and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 provides that the Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure for the 2019-2020 school year; and

**WHEREAS**, that the Sayreville Board of Education hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2019-2020 school year at the sum of \$64,001.00 and be it further resolved that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum is not exceeded. Current 2018-2019 school-year expenditures are \$19,522.92 and budget is \$70,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2019-2020 Budget Comparison with Justification Reports include the supporting documentation for this 2019-2020 Budget and also contains an itemization of certain expenditures and revenues required under administrative regulations; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt the proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 for the

School District General Fund Budget of \$95,752,945.00, including a local tax levy \$63,155,849.00; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt the proposed Budget for fiscal school year 2019-2020 for the school district special revenue fund budget of \$2,475,104.00; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt the proposed Budget for fiscal school year 2019-2020 for the school district debt service fund budget of \$3,611,164.00, including a local tax levy \$3,531,727.00.

2. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to approve the following:

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Education hereby appoints the following Educational Services (“FIRM”) and approves the Agreement for Professional Services between the Board and the Firm(s) for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The Board shall pay the Firm(s) per the fee structure established, not to exceed as listed below for school year 2019-2020.

- Sharon Ferraro, to provide Sign Language Services at a rate of \$200.00 per visit for the first two hours, and additional charge of \$75.00 per hour thereafter, not to exceed \$2,000.00.

- Jem Rehabilitation, LLC to provide Physical Therapy at a rate of \$85.00/hour, not to exceed \$60,000.00.
  - Jewish Vocational Services to provide Various Services per fee schedule, not to exceed \$18,000.00.

  - Aida Pereira to provide Bilingual Speech Language Evaluation Services, per fee schedule, not to exceed \$7,500.00.
  - Rutgers University Behavioral Healthcare to provide Therapeutic and Crisis Intervention services to Sayreville Middle School, Samsel Upper Elementary, Arleth, Elementary, Eisenhower, Elementary, Truman Elementary, and Wilson Elementary students, not to exceed \$322,000.00
  - Michael J. Simon, MD., F.A.C.P. to provide Professional Services to include Medical Interpretation, feedback and advise pertaining to employee health on an as needed basis not to exceed \$2,000.00.
  - Star Pediatric Home Care Agency to provide Nursing Services at a rate of \$58.00/hour for RN Services and \$48.00/hour for LPN services, not to exceed \$65,000.00.
  - Summit Speech School to provide Itinerant Services at a rate of \$155.00/hour, not to exceed \$125,000.00.
  - Quiver Farm Projects, Inc. to provide a Traveling Farm exhibit during Camp XL Extended School Year, not to exceed \$550.00.
3. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to approve nonpublic security funding for the 2018-2019 school year as follows:
