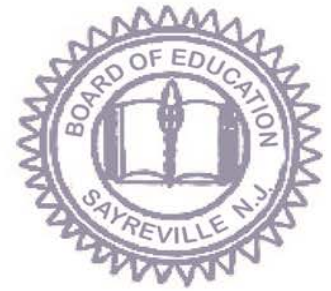



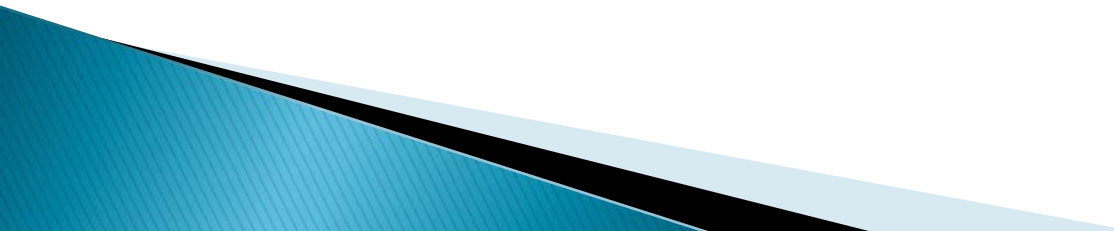

- ▶ Congratulations to the Boys and Girls track teams, who both took 1st Place at the annual JFK High School Mustang Relays. Go Bombers!






