

### PHYS ED TO GO HIGH-TECH AT CAEC

When students at the Charleroi Elementary Center go to phys ed class in the near future, it won't look anything like it has in the past if teacher Amanda Bashioum has anything to say about it. Told by Administration to send a wish list of items she'd like to enhance her classroom,

Amanda didn't hesitate.

She submitted a request for The Lu, a completely immersive system that lets students have fun while being stimulated physically, intellectually, socially, and emotionally. It includes a 3D camera, projector, complete sound and lighting system, and internet access that transforms any space into an interactive and immersive educational environment.



The LU comes with a \$30,000 price tag, but Superintendent Dr. Zelich immediately jumped on board. He promised Bashioum if she was able to raise \$15,000 he would try to match that amount using COVID-19 relief funds.

So far, she has done well with her efforts. She was awarded a \$1,000 grant through

Kids of Steel, an organization that encourages activity and healthy choices among young people. But her biggest boost came from Lee Supply. President Kevin Lee received a visit from Ms. Bashioum

to try and solicit donations toward the project, and when he heard about it decided to designate a \$10,000 donation made through the Education Foundation to the LU. "It sounds like just the type of thing we like to encourage with the kids," said Mr. Lee. "We like to support athletics and physical activity, and this seems like such a great way to start kids off learning about fitness."

With the Bashioum is accepting monetary donations that can be made through CASDEF by either dropping it off at the school or mailing it to CASDEF, P.O. Box 382, Charleroi, PA 15022, and marking "LU" on your check or donation.

There is also a donation button set up on the Foundation's Facebook page to donate directly through the site.

She also has solicited other businesses for donations and is collecting gift cards and other items to auction or raffle off later this year, and the CASDEF plans to work with her to complete the funding.

After getting the green light to move forward, Amanda drove two hours to a school in Ohio that is currently using the program. "I'm not aware of another LU in the immediate area," she said. "I wanted to see first hand how the kids reacted to it. It was amazing! The kids were so involved, and when I was there not a single kid was sitting on the sidelines. Everyone was involved and couldn't wait for another turn.

That's not something you see all the time in class." Beside physical activity, the Lu has applications to cover other subject matters such as math, STEAM, languages, geography and more. "I am hoping to be one of the first schools in our area that has this," she continued. "I want Charleroi to be the school that other schools want to visit."




