WHEREAS, the NJSBA CPS program has offered voluntary participation in a cooperative pricing system for the aggregate purchase of energy aggregation, as well as VMware® products and services; and

WHEREAS, the Sayreville Board of Education in the county of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, desires to participate in the NJSBA TEC Cooperative Pricing System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED on the 17th day of October 2017 by the Sayreville Board of Education, county of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

TITLE

This RESOLUTION shall be known and may be cited as the "NJSBA Cooperative Pricing Resolution of the Sayreville Board of Education."

AUTHORITY

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-11, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary Erin Hill is hereby authorized to enter into the NJSBA TEC Cooperative Pricing System Agreement.

CONTRACTING UNIT

The New Jersey School Boards Association shall be responsible for complying with the “Public School Contracts Law,” N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 *et seq.*, and all other applicable laws in connection with the preparation, bidding, negotiation and execution of contracts in connection with the NJSBA Cooperative Pricing System.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.
