A – VISION 2030: FINANCE & INFRASTRUCTURE

Discussion Item: Committee Report

FINANCE

1. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to approve the list of bills dated June 13, 2017, prepared by the Board Secretary in the amount of \$2,431,710.12 for the Operating Account.

2. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to award the bid for Partitions and Classroom Improvements for the Harry S. Truman Elementary School to Ascend Construction Management, Inc. as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$267,000.00 for bids opened on Tuesday, June 6, 2017.

3. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Education of Sayreville to approved the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby appoints the following Architectural Firm (“Firm”) and approves the Agreement for Professional Services between the Board and the Firm DI Group Architecture. The Board shall pay the Firm \$26,500.00 for construction documents, bidding services and construction administration for Partial Window Replacement at the Arleth Elementary School.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that notice of the award of the above described contract for Professional Services shall be provided as required by N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5a (1).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution and the Agreement shall be maintained on file and available for public inspection in the Board’s office.

WHEREAS, a board of education desiring to deposit such funds into a capital reserve account at year end must do so during the month of June by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Sayreville Board of Education wishes to deposit unexpended line-item appropriations from the 2016-2017 school year into a Capital Reserve at year end to be withdrawn in subsequent school years; and

WHEREAS, the Sayreville Board of Education has determined that up to \$1,000,000 is available for such purpose;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Sayreville Board of Education that it hereby authorizes the Business Administrator to make a transfer at year’s end of unexpended line-item appropriation from the 2016-2017 budget into Capital Reserve in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000, consistent with all applicable laws and regulations.
